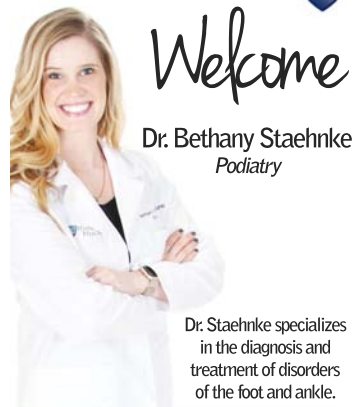

# County seeks a study to increase speed limit on Hwy. 3 or cut-across

The speed limit may soon increase from 55 to 60 mph on Pennington County State Aid Highway 3, more commonly known as the "cut-across." At its meeting Tuesday, Sept. 25, the Pennington County Board approved a resolution asking the Minnesota Department of Transportation to complete a required speed study to begin the process.

Commissioners are asking MnDOT to study CSAH 3 from the Pennington/Polk County line to CSAH 27. CSAH 27 is the road that leads to Gully.

Polk County is expected to seek a similar study for CSAH 21 from the Pennington/Polk County line to Highway 220. CSAH 3 turns into CSAH 21 once motorists cross into Polk County.

"It's not just your typical speed study," said Pennington County Engineer Mike

Flaagan.

Flaagan added that MnDOT will study such things as access points, crash rates, passing zones and shoulder width. He expected the study would take a few months.

Flaagan initially wanted to stop the CSAH 3 study at the intersection with Highway 59. Commissioner Don Jensen, who has advocated for an increased speed limit on CSAH 3 for years, had suggested expanding the

study to the intersection with CSAH 27. Other commissioners ultimately agreed.

Commissioners noted that speeds on CSAH 3 are already around 60 mph, if not higher. Chairperson Neil Peterson suggested driving 60 mph and seeing how many people pass the motorist.

Commissioner Darryl Tveitbakk pointed out that it seemed logical to increase the speed. "You can only see

eight miles in every direction when you're out there," he said.

County Board approved two separate, related motions regarding the Mark Boulevard project.

With one abstention, commissioners accepted the high bid to remove a shed from county-owned property at 435 Mark Blvd. Neil Jensen of Goodridge had the

They enjoyed some delicious carrot cake and coffee

and some good memories and socializing. During the course of the visit, a poem by Harry's brother, Paul Sjulson, of New Braunfels, Texas, who was unfortunately unable to attend in person, was shared and several photos were taken of Harry and Bernice.

So, what was so unusual about a couple of old friends sharing an afternoon visit? Turns out that Bernice, Harry, and Paul are the last

remaining classmates from the Class of 1938 at Lancaster High School, and this Wednesday afternoon marked their 80-year class reunion.

The three were part of a 19-member class, with 11 boys and eight girls.

Bernice, who will be 98 in November, was a member of the graduating class of 1938 at Lancaster, but had spent her junior year of high school at Hallock, preceded

# Oakland Park Communities gets top marks

Oakland Park Communities, a 35-bed nursing home in Thief River Falls, recently received a zero deficiency survey, a rarity among nursing homes. Their most recent survey was conducted Sept. 10 through 13th. It is believed the last time a zero deficiency survey was given in Thief River Falls was in the 1990s to Convalescent and Nursing Care.

It's exciting news for employees at the facility and a tremendous accomplishment. Since Nov. 28, 2017, 218 survey results have been posted for Minnesota nursing homes. There are

376 nursing homes in Minnesota. Out of those 218 surveys, only nine other facilities in Minnesota have received zero deficiencies according to Data.Medicare. Gov. The highest number of deficiencies was 42. This is a tremendous accomplishment for Oakland Park and a victory for Thief River Falls.

The Minnesota Department of Health, Health Regulation Division, under a cooperative agreement with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid, is responsible for ensuring that facilities accepting Medicare and Medicaid payment for serv-

ices provided to program beneficiaries meet federal and state regulations and certification rules.

The surveys, typically conducted over a period of three to five days, evaluate the quality of care and services provided, as well as the appropriateness of the facility's building, equipment, staffing, policies and procedures. The surveys are always unannounced and can be conducted on weekdays, evenings and nights as well as on weekends and holidays.



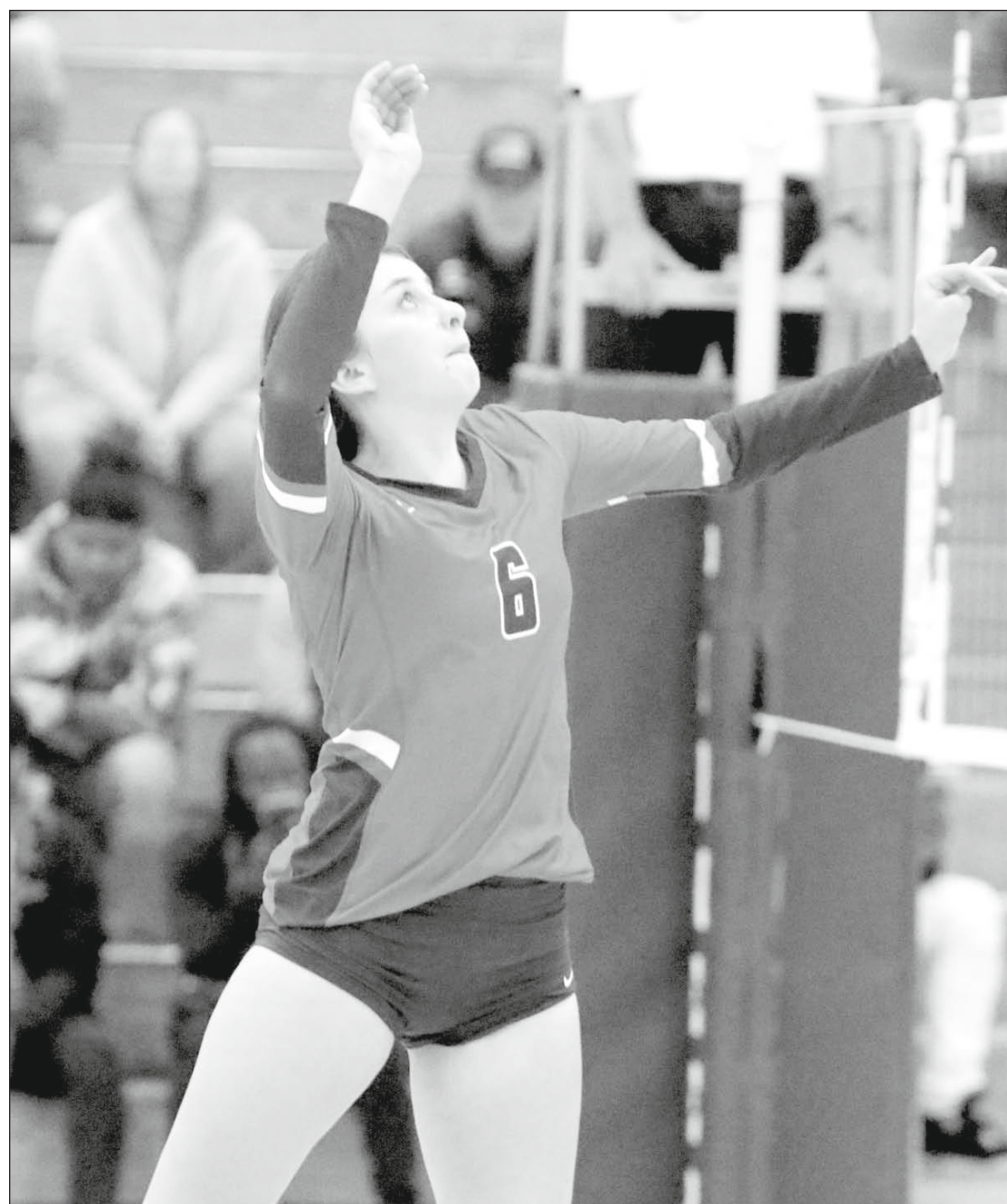

## Northland gets season hat trick against Itasca

Beating a competitive team three times in one season is always a daunting task and on Wednesday night, the Northland Community & Technical College volleyball team accomplished the feat with three-set win over visiting Itasca Community College.

The Pioneers pulled away late in the first set to win 25-19, and stayed in control for the remainder to win the final two sets 25-13 and 25-12.

"They are definitely a scrappy team - that's one of the things I told the girls is to not overlook them," said Northland Head Coach Courtney Nordby. "We knew they would be improved, but we've also been working on some things and I thought we did a nice job executing those things."

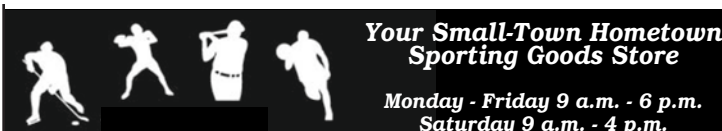

## Wolf population is stable in Minnesota

Minnesota's wolf population estimate was 2,655 wolves and 465 wolf packs during the winter of 2017-2018 within Minnesota's wolf range, an estimate that is statistically unchanged from the previous winter, according to the Department of Natural Resources.

"Subtle changes in wolf population numbers year to year indicate that Minnesota supports a healthy wolf population and the long-term trends demonstrate that the wolf population is fully recovered," said Dan Stark, large carnivore specialist for the DNR.

The survey's margin of error was plus or minus about 700 wolves and makes the estimate statistically unchanged from the previous winter's estimate of approximately 2,856 wolves and 500 wolf packs.

The population survey is conducted in mid-winter near the low point of the annual population cycle. Immediately following birth of pups each spring, the wolf population typically doubles, though many pups do not survive to the following winter. Pack counts during winter are assumed to represent minimum estimates given the challenges with detecting all members of a pack together at the same time.

Survey results suggest pack sizes were the same as last year (4.85 versus 4.8) and packs used larger territories (61 versus 54 square miles) than the previous winter. Although neither individually represented a significant change from recent years, slightly larger

pack territories last winter explain the lower population estimate and are consistent with estimated changes in deer numbers in many parts of the wolf range.

"The accuracy of our wolf population estimate is dependent on radio-collaring a representative sample of wolf packs," said Dr. John Erb, DNR wolf research biologist.

Annual wolf capture efforts are focused on areas for radio-collaring that are believed to collectively represent the overall wolf range, particularly with respect to land cover and deer density. Capture success varies each year, some collared wolves die or disperse, and some radio-collars prematurely fail, creating annual variability in the degree to which collared packs are representative of the entire population.

"Nonetheless, confidence intervals for the past two surveys widely overlap, indicating no significant change from last year," Erb said.

Although wolf population estimates have been conducted annually since 2012, the portion of the survey that is used to calculate total and pack-occupied wolf range is completed every five years. This past winter's survey estimated a 9,321 square mile increase in total wolf range from the 2012-2013 wolf population survey; however, the survey results indicated that only about 23 percent of this new area, or 2,175 square miles, was deemed to be occupied by resident wolf packs during the winter of 2017-2018.

Minnesota's wolf popula-

tion remains above the state's minimum goal of at least 1,600 wolves and is above the federal recovery goal of 1,251 to 1,400 wolves.

The DNR's goal for wolf management, as outlined in the state's wolf management plan, is to ensure the long-term survival of wolves in Minnesota while addressing wolf-human conflicts. Wolves in Minnesota returned to the federal list of threatened species as a result of a Washington, D.C. federal district court ruling in December 2014.

### Special youth deer hunting season set for Oct. 18-21 in 28 permit areas

Youth ages 10-15 can participate in a special deer season that runs from Thursday, Oct. 18, to Sunday, Oct. 21, in 28 permit areas of southeastern and northwestern Minnesota, including in the Twin Cities metro permit area 601, according to the Department of Natural Resources.

"Youth deer season is about giving kids a unique opportunity to get out into the woods with a parent or mentor," said James Burnham, DNR recruitment, retention and reactivation (R3) coordinator. "Many students get a couple days off school for teacher workshops during the youth season so the break is a great time to go hunting and help share the passion for being outside that so many of Minnesota's hunters and anglers have."

Deer permit areas open to the hunt are: 101, 105, 111, 114, 201, 203, 208, 209, 256, 257, 260, 263, 264, 267, 268, 338, 339, 341, 342, 343, 344 (including Whitewater State Game Refuge), 345, 346, 347, 348, 349, 601 and 603. Blaze orange or blaze pink requirements apply to all hunters, trappers and adult mentors in areas open for the youth firearms deer season. Public land is open, and private land is open if the hunters have landowner permission.

Since it was first implemented in 2004, the youth deer season has expanded and encompassed new areas - creating a growing number of opportunities to develop Minnesota's next generation of hunters. Passing along the annual fall deer hunting tradition does more than contribute to the bottom line of businesses in communities

across Minnesota. It helps fund conservation efforts that benefit wildlife, habitat and water quality, making a better Minnesota for all.

**How to participate**  
 Youth ages 10 through 15 must obtain a firearms deer license. Youth ages 12 to 15 need to have completed firearms safety or, if not, can obtain an apprentice hunter validation.

During the youth season, a parent, guardian or mentor age 18 or older must accompany the youth and only need a license if the youth is taking advantage of the apprentice validation option. Party hunting on a youth license is not allowed - so youth must take and tag their own deer.

The bag limit for the youth season is one deer only. Youth may use their regular license or a bonus permit if they take an antlerless deer, regardless of the management designation. Bucks must be tagged with the youth's regular license. Participation does not affect eligibility for the regular deer season; however, the harvested deer counts against the youth's annual statewide bag limit and the bag limit for the deer permit area.

If hunting in permit areas 346, 348, 349 and 603, the early antlerless only season is in effect from Oct. 18 to Oct. 21, so adults and youth can hunt at the same time in these areas; however, if a youth harvests a deer and wishes to continue hunting during the early antlerless only season they must purchase an early antlerless permit.

The Minnesota Trappers Association will host a youth field trapping class for ages 10-17 during the month of October.

The classroom portion will be held from 4 to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 10 and Thursday, Oct. 11 at the

Thief River Falls Public Library meeting room, with a field day scheduled from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday, Oct. 13 at the Pennington County Sportsmen Club.

There is no cost to participate.

### Harvest season demands our attention

American Crystal Sugar Company reported in late August that pre-pile of the sugar beet harvest had been going well. Sugar content was reported high at about 17.8 percent, which is really high. Full stockpile harvest, according to East Grand Forks Harvest information, was expected to begin Oct. 1, weather permitting.

Northwestern Minnesota was short on rain during the summer, but moisture levels began to creep up in September. Weather forecasts continue to emphasize unsettled weather, which means rain and wind. Long-time residents of northwestern Minnesota know why this is important. It means motorists traveling on area Minnesota highways need to be aware of large farm equipment on the roads and dragging mud from the fields onto the roads.

Ray Starr, acting state traffic engineer,

said, "Motorists need to be prepared to encounter slow-moving farm vehicles, especially on rural, two-lane roads."

In the past several years, state officials have tried to be diligent about removing mud from the highways, but a thin layer of the Red River mud always remains. Add a little moisture to the mud and the roads almost become as slick as when they're ice-covered.

Most of the farm equipment crashes and fatalities are related to distractions, speed and alcohol. From 2015 to 2017, there were six fatalities and 386 crashes involving at least one farm vehicle, according to the Department of Public Safety's crash data.

This means motorists need to pay attention all the time, but during harvest season, as in winter, it's best to slow down and pay extra attention. Using caution and being patient around farm equipment is also vitally important for your safety and the safety of farm equipment operators.

## Tamarac NWR offers its first Minnesota Master Naturalist class

*Editor's note: Lori Sorteberg of Thief River Falls wrote this week that she attended the Minnesota Master Naturalist Class at Tamarac National Wildlife Refuge, which is north of Detroit Lakes, in June of this year. She explained that this is somewhat similar to the Master Gardener Program as participants have to volunteer 40 hours every year. "I am not a real outdoorsy type of person but it was so fascinating and fun!"*

Nineteen enthusiastic students completed a week-long Minnesota Master Naturalist class held at Tamarac National Wildlife Refuge June 11-15, joining the ranks of over 2,000 volunteers trained through the program since it was established in 2005. The stated mission of the Minnesota Master Naturalist Program is "to promote awareness, understanding and stewardship of Minnesota's natural environment by training informed volunteers dedicated to conservation education and service within their communities."

Tamarac's class focused on one of the three major biomes or provinces in Minnesota, "Big Woods, Big Rivers," otherwise known as the eastern broadleaf forest. Think maples and bass-woods! This biome covers a sash of land from northwestern Minnesota to the southeast roughly following a gradient of moisture and temperature. Each day of training covered major topics to better understand the components and processes of the Big Woods. While some of the course was held inside the Tamarac Discovery Center, students participated in hands-on learning in the outdoors every day with guest field scientists.

Neil Powers, Refuge manager, warmly began and

closed the week by welcoming students and expressing his appreciation for the many volunteers who help the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Minnesota and elsewhere. The first day focused on the basic geology of west central Minnesota, its glacial history and the role of soil and fire in the distribution of prairies, oak savannas and pinelands, courtesy of Dr. Charles Parson of Bemidji. He also led field sessions to interpret layered gravels and the history of the Ottertail River. Students also began to work on group projects called "Capstone Projects" to help Tamarac refuge staff, such as writing and drawing how-to instructions for "Tom's Tamarac Picnic Tables," planning plantings and making protective tree cages.

Day two, Tuesday, was all about plant communities. Tamarac Wildlife Biologist Wayne Bringer brought management decisions to life in a field trip that clearly showed the importance of understanding both plant ecology and detailed wildlife species' needs in all parts of the 48,000 acre wildlife refuge. Bringer further explained that Tamarac aims for a mosaic of habitats in various stages of maturity to benefit more wildlife species. Tuesday afternoon was spent with Bemidji plant ecologist George-Ann Maxson, exploring the plants and trees along the Old Indian Trail. George-Ann also treated the class to many insect and bird stories along the way.

Wednesday began with a very dynamic PhD student from Grand Forks, N.D., Lynda LaFond, who is a small mammal biologist. She had placed several Sherman live-traps near the Discovery Center and baited them with peanut butter. The wily critters of Tamarac found ways to get the peanut butter without getting caught, but one bear left a giant tooth hole in the side of the trap. Lynda presented a lively overview of food webs, foraging theory, reproductive strategies, skull interpretation and more. Wednesday afternoon was

all about water quality, watersheds and using aquatic insects to help interpret water quality. Can you picture 19 students gleefully scraping nets along the bottom of the Ottertail River on a sunny June day? Aquatic biologist Jared House helped everyone identify their insects, with caddis fly larvae and water scorpions generating lots of interest. Gina Kemper, Tamarac biological technician, shared her water sampling expertise with the class and gave a good overview of how the data are used.

Thursday began with local birders, Nancy Henke and Steve Midthune, leading students to several local hotspots in and near Tamarac to view waterfowl such as rust-necked grebes and loons and elsewhere scarlet tanagers and several warblers. The outing was followed by lunch at Chippewa picnic area. The afternoon was spent largely working on the students' Capstone Projects, although some time was carved out for a Tamarac Watch, a quiet reflective time to write, draw or simply enjoy the beauty of the refuge.

On Friday, Dr. Stephen Carlson, with the University of Minnesota and a staff member of the Minnesota Master Naturalist Program, watched the class present seven group Capstone Projects and discussed the next steps in becoming a volunteer. To maintain their certification, each volunteer must donate 40 hours a year doing such things as helping with education programs, interpretation, citizen science, helping in an office, seed collecting, or invasive species removal for just some examples.

This class was organized by trained MNAT instructors: Kelly Blackledge, Tamarac visitor services manager, and Connie Carlson and Nancy Brennan, Minnesota master naturalist volunteers. It is hoped that all of the class members who took "Big Woods, Big Rivers" will find a niche in which to explore, teach and conserve our natural resources.

## Timeline expanded for hog farmers

The U.S. Department of Transportation has expanded the timeline for hog producers to file for a trade mitigation package through the Market Facilitation Program.

The deadline has been expanded for producers with whom the Aug. 1, 2018, date doesn't accurately represent the number of head of live hogs they own. Producers may now choose any date between July 15 to Aug. 15, 2018, that correctly reflects their actual operation.

Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue announced in July that USDA would act to

aid farmers in response to trade damage from unjustified retaliation. President Donald Trump directed Perdue to craft a short-term relief strategy to protect agricultural producers while the administration works on free, fair and reciprocal trade deals to open more markets in the long run to help American farmers compete globally. These programs will assist agricultural producers to meet some of the costs of disrupted markets.

The sign-up period for MFP for eligible commodities runs through Jan. 15,

2019, with information and instructions provided at [www.farmers.gov/mfp](http://www.farmers.gov/mfp).

MFP was established under the statutory authority of the Commodity Credit Corporation CCC Charter Act and is under the administration of USDA's Farm Service Agency.

economy in 2017, and at 16 percent, is the largest sector contributing to the state's private gross domestic product; and

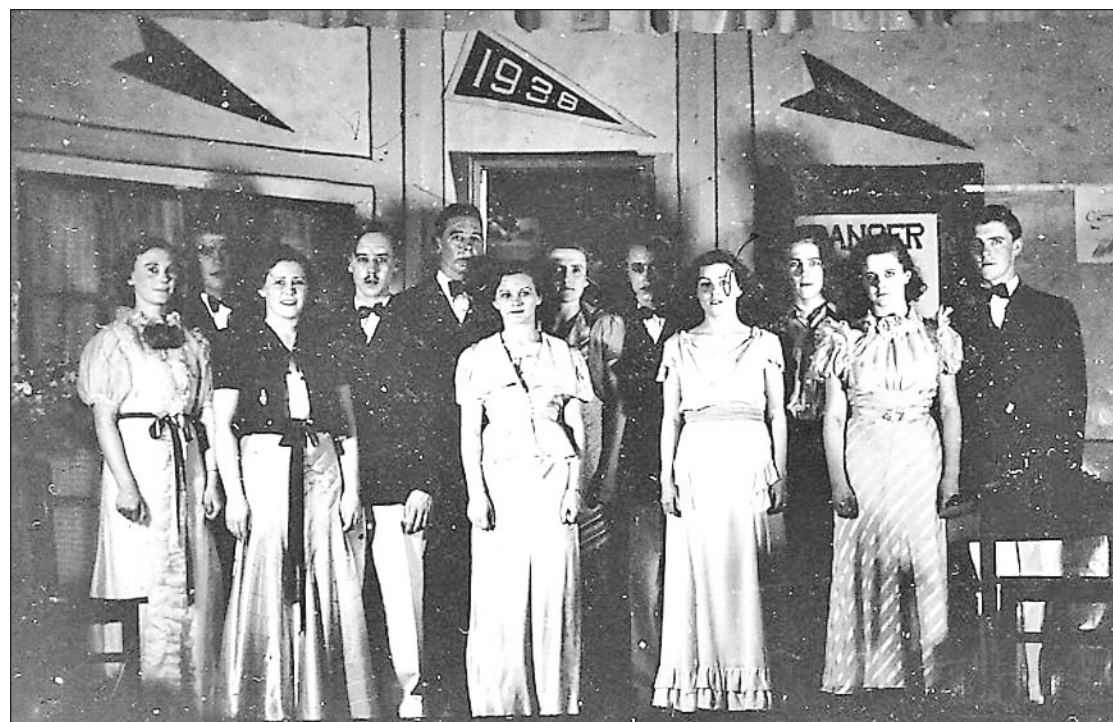
*Whereas: In 2017, workers took home \$21 billion in wages from Minnesota manufacturing jobs, the second-highest amount among the state's business sectors; and*

(Continued from Page 1) Township, had attended the north McKinley Country School there. They were reluctant to send Paul, who was about two years older than Harry, to high school on his own, so they devised a plan to send the two boys at the same time. Their mother, Cora, had been a rural school teacher for several years, and the year before Paul was ready to attend the ninth grade at Lancaster, she was teaching at the Caribou School and took Harry to stay there with her for most of the year. With his mother's help, he was able to complete three years of school, the sixth, seventh, and eighth grades during that winter. For the final six weeks of the school year, Harry recalls, he returned to the McKinley School and took the tests to complete the eighth grade under the teacher there, Bert Amundson. He adds that it wasn't difficult to get through more than one grade in a year because a student could listen to the teacher's lectures and instructions for the higher grade pupils since all the activity was right there in one room.

The two boys moved to Lancaster with their mother, where the family rented a place for their freshman year of high school during the 1933-34 year, but then took a year off to stay at home, about 15 miles from Lancaster, and help on their farm. Their sister, Gladys, had suffered an appendicitis attack and their parents were occupied with her surgery and recovery, while the boys took on the responsibility for milking 18 cows every day and doing the other farm work, as well. They also did quite a bit of trapping of fox and other animals that year. By the time that they could have gone back to school, it was too late in the year to get a good start in their studies and they just took the year off.

During 1935-36 school year, they boarded with the August Lindquist family for their sophomore year of school. For their junior year, the boys lived in a one-room house built by Paul Elfstrom, which was about two blocks from the high school. Harry recalls that their "home" quickly became a "den of iniquity" for many of their male classmates, who would come by in the evenings, to play cards, smoke, and even drink. Harry states that, while this was going on, he and his brother did not partake of the smoking or drinking, but did play cards. For their senior year, they again boarded with the Lindquist family.

Paul and Harry both played basketball, under the guidance of Coach H. Bruce Willson, who also taught the agriculture class. Paul was center on the team that won both Sub-district and District in 1937. Paul says his favorite class was "basketball," but also enjoyed general science. Harry's favorites were algebra and chemistry. Both of them say that Billy Nordling was their best friend.

After they graduated, Paul and Harry attended a year of "teacher training" classes at Lincoln High School in Thief River Falls and then both taught in rural schools for two years, before hitchhiking to southern California after World War II began, to work in airplane factories there. Both tried to enlist, but were turned down at first. Harry later served with the Army of Occupation in Japan for a year.

Paul, who is now 99, married Lorraine Swanson in 1947 and they established a turkey farm at St. Hilaire. They had four daughters, Sherry, Coral, Sibyl, and Julie and now have many grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Paul and his family later moved to Glenwood, and later still, to New Braunfels, Texas, where they currently reside.

Harry, now 97, married

Vivian Anderson in 1947 and joined Paul in the Sjulson Hatchery business, retiring from the turkey raising enterprise in 1981. They had three children, Donna, Roger, and Neil, as well as several grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Harry and Vivian continue to live in St. Hilaire.

(Continued from Page 1) high bid of \$856. Alan Nelson of Gonvick had the other bid of \$150. Commissioner Don Jensen abstained from voting since Neil Jensen is his son.

Commissioners also accepted the high bid to remove a house from the same property. Steve Olson of Thief River Falls had the only bid of \$623.01.

Olson and Neil Jensen will remove the respective structures. Both structures were located on land formerly owned by Glenn Dvor-

sak. The county purchased the property in order to construct the upcoming Mark Boulevard bridge.

The Mark Boulevard bridge and roadway project is estimated to cost \$5.77 million. The project is not expected to impact local taxes. Construction is expected to start in late summer/early fall 2019 and be completed in 2020.

The new roadway and bridge will connect Mark Boulevard, north of Sanford Health, to CSAH 8 east of Challenger Elementary School.

Flaagan also provided information on other plans related to the Mark Boulevard project. Two roundabouts are proposed as part of the project. One po-

tential roundabout would be located at the intersection of Highway 32 and CSAH 16 near Brodin Comfort Systems. The other would be located at the intersection of Pennington Avenue and CSAH 8, adjacent to Challenger Elementary School.

With regard to the former roundabout, Flaagan said the median would extend beyond County Road 75. That road is located northwest of the intersection of Highway 32 and CSAH 16. Plans are to now remove 500 feet of County Road 75, meaning that motorists would be unable to travel from CSAH 16 to CR 75. Flaagan said that he wants make this change next year before the roundabout is built.

Employees credit leadership, specifically Laura Erickson, administrator, and Jenny Stromlund, director of nursing, for the turnaround.

"Over the past two and a half to three years, all of the staff have worked hard at improving our quality measures, increasing and maintaining staffing levels and ensuring compliance with state and federal regulations. These efforts have been reflected in our health inspection results," said Stromlund.

According to Erickson, Oakland Park Communities has steadily improved survey results. In 2014, Oakland Park received 22 deficiencies and 2015 had 14 deficiencies. In 2016, Oakland Park received four and in 2017 there were five deficiencies.

Erickson said not only do the number of deficiencies matter, but the scope and severity of a deficiency, which is noted by a letter assigned to each deficiency. Below is a scope and severity grid. Whenever a deficiency is given in the blue section (F, H, I, J, K, and L) and it is related to resident care, it indicates "substandard care." These deficiencies really indicate the type of care a resident is receiving. Facilities want to avoid these deficiencies if at all possible; however, the worst type of deficiency is an Im-

mediate Jeopardy (IJ) - deficiencies deemed a J, K, or L. In situations where surveyors find non-compliance at this level, they require immediate action to fix the problem to avoid further injury and risk to residents. When surveyors discover this level of deficiency related to resident care, surveyors will not leave the building until the situation is corrected.

Erickson said an additional element of change was a shift in how state surveys are conducted. Surveyors spend more time with the residents interviewing them as well as asking frontline staff how they do things, why they do them that way, and what they know about residents. Surveyors also watch how staff care for and interact with residents.

"The team at Oakland Park has really grown and

developed in the last few years," said Erickson. "We have a great team who puts their all into providing quality care for our residents and making this a great place to live and work."

Oakland Park Communities employs about 70 people. It has 35 beds approved for Medicaid and Medicare.

Oakland Park also recently received a five star rating on Nursing Home Compare from Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

"Oakland Park is proud to continue to offer the local community with quality skilled nursing facility services," said Stromlund.

## Thief River Care Center

Thief River Care Center is another nursing home facility located in Thief River Falls that accepts Medicaid and Medicare patients. It also has a rating of 5. It has 70 beds approved for Medicaid and Medicare.

There are other facilities in Thief River Falls, but assisted living facilities must comply with a different set of regulations.

## Selecting a nursing home

The Minnesota Department of Health notes that when choosing a nursing home, review the survey finding to help make an informed choice when considering a nursing home.

"However, it is important to use more than one piece of information to make the decision of which nursing home is right for the care of a family member or friend. Consumers should use the survey findings information as an aid to, not a substitute for, an in-person visit to the nursing home under consideration.

Visits to nursing facilities being considered and discussion with friends, family and staff members prior to deciding which facility will best meet your needs are essential."

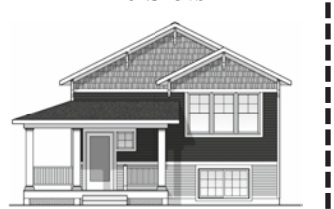
