Digi-Key

Labor not pleased with subcontractor

Small groups gathered near the entrances to Digi-Key work areas on Wednesday, June 5, to bring attention to their complaints regarding how a subcontractor at the Digi-Key project is paying and treating its employees.

The subcontractor is Millennium Concrete of Coralville, Iowa. Construction unions claim Millennium is failing to properly pay its workers.

Because state funds are involved in the construction of the Digi-Key project, it is a prevailing wage project. Basically, this means contractors are required to pay "prevailing wage," or a determined wage based on the type of job and amount paid for that job in the location

where the job is being performed.

Wednesday morning, Darrell Lende, president of Northwest Minnesota Building and Construction Trades Council, said Millennium Concrete workers say they've been paid less. As an example, prevailing wages require the contractor to pay cement masons \$44 per hour and ironworkers \$24.81 per hour. So, if a cement mason is being paid the wage of an ironworker, they're being underpaid.

In a news release issued Tuesday, St. Paul-based Fair Contracting Foundation stated that Millennium Concrete misclassified concrete workers as ironworkers to avoid paying a higher rate. Based on 19 weeks of payroll, the alleged misclassification works out to \$300,000 in total lost wages, the foun-

dation said.

The issue of lost wages has been in the headlines recently. Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz signed the state's new wage theft law that toughens penalties for wage theft and provides additional money to state agencies to crack down on the practice.

When asked why McShane Construction, the general contractor, is responsible for the actions of a subcontractor, Lende said McShane is ultimately responsible for making sure everyone is paid the correct wages because it is a prevailing wage project. When they get the certified payroll, he said, McShane is supposed to be checking it and making sure everyone is paid correctly. He also said they are also supposed to be out on the job and checking with everyone to see what

everyone is doing, and the foremen are supposed to be letting them know what they are doing on a daily basis.


When asked if this wage theft involving prevailing wages is an issue throughout the state, why select Digi-Key as the site for the event on Wednesday, Lende agreed it's not just this project, but as far as they know, it's the only project in Minnesota where Millennium Concrete is working.

But the issues are not just with prevailing wages. Groups participating in the event Wednesday have stated the issues include mistreatment and possibly

discrimination.

According to information offered by Ocatavio Chung-Bustamante, marketing representative for LIUNA (Laborers' International Union of North America), one of Millennium Concrete's employees reported sustaining a serious injury on the job but receiving no medical treatment and working hurt until he couldn't keep going. "After he brought a note from a chiropractor, the employee said Millennium wouldn't let him return to work and office staff acted as if they didn't know who he was even though he is

Labor Department response

James Honerman, communications director for the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry, stated that the Digi-Key project is funded in part by state funds, so it is a prevailing wage project. It is required to pay prevailing wages based on the type of work the workers are performing. He said the department cannot confirm or deny that they have an ongoing investigation.

Honerman added that wage theft occurs when employers do not pay their

workers what is owed them for the work they have performed. It's estimated up to 40,000 Minnesota workers pursue complaints of wage theft each year because they have been denied a fair day's pay for a fair day's work.

He said, "Legislation was passed in May 2019 that will invest \$3.1 million in new funding over the next two years in the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry's enforcement of the state's wage and hour laws. The new Minnesota Wage Theft law will create addi-


tional protections for workers, including adding criminal penalties for employers who commit wage theft. This additional funding will allow the agency to add critical staff needed to perform more strategic and targeted workplace enforcement and conduct greater outreach and education for employers, workers and their communities."

The Minnesota Department of Human Rights oversees discrimination cases.

Citizens asked to help

Help decide what happens to the Thief River Falls City Auditorium.

A public input process to help determine the future of the Thief River Falls City Auditorium will be held at 7 p.m. on June 18 in the board room of the new Justice Center. Dr. Virajita Sing and a graduate student from the University of Minnesota, will be leading the process. Prior to the start of the meeting, a public viewing and visit of the auditorium will be conducted.

The entire process is expected to be similar to the downtown rehabilitation project conducted in 2017. That effort resulted in a master plan for downtown Thief River Falls. The overall goal was to create a unified, welcoming environment that would revitalize the downtown community, support current businesses and encourage new business development.

Considerable efforts to

gather information about the city auditorium and arena, and engage the public have already begun. As a result, an application to have the building listed on the National Register of Historical Places has been prepared, and a draft narrative has been written by a consultant through a Minnesota Historical Society Legacy grant. Having the building listed on the National Register makes it qualified for some federal dollars as well as large Legacy grants through the Minnesota Historical Society.

The city auditorium is in the heart of Thief River Falls and belongs to the county. No decision has been made regarding the future of the building, but it remains in doubt.

Those leading the effort see some of its potential uses as an environmentally-controlled room in which to store historic, city, county and public documents; and a

venue for concerts, dances, wedding receptions, theater productions, and shared work spaces.

History

The first city auditorium burned in 1933 and plans were put into motion immediately to construct a replacement on the same site.

Like the rest of the country in 1933, Pennington County was in the depths of the economic depression of the 1930s. Sensitive to the high unemployment in the community, the City ensured that the demolition and construction were run like relief projects. For example, hiring was limited to local men and was coordinated by the County Poor Overseer. Those employed were given a standard wage and were given a limited number of shifts in order to maximize the number of unemployed who would benefit.

On February 26, 1934,

City considers management company for REA

This would be a second meeting with VenuWorks

The Thief River Falls City Council plans to meet this month with VenuWorks, an arena management company. That meeting has been tentatively scheduled for Tuesday, June 18. At that time, the council plans to meet as the Committee of the Whole immediately following the regular council meeting scheduled to begin at 5:30 p.m. that day.

Arena Manager Missy Sletten submitted her resignation last month. Her resignation is effective Wednesday, June 12, and she is leaving to work at the Red Lake County Court Administrator's Office.

Months ago, VenuWorks representatives met with city leaders. Nothing was decided at that time. This would be the second meeting between the two groups.

Council member Rachel Prudhomme had suggested scheduling a meeting with VenuWorks while city leaders were in the process of negotiating a new lease with the Norskies. She and council member Jason Aarestad broached the topic at the council meeting Tuesday,

June 4. That suggestion led to a tense exchange between Prudhomme and Mayor Brian Holmer about whose responsibility it was to schedule a Committee of the Whole meeting.

Council member Jerald Brown voiced his support for meeting with VenuWorks again. "Maybe it's not for this city. Maybe it is," he said.

Holmer questioned when the council wanted to meet as Committee of the Whole since it may be difficult to schedule an extra meeting during the summer.

Prudhomme replied that the council also needed to invite the Norskies.

This meeting doesn't concern the Norskies, Holmer said.

Aarestad, who said he has worked for seven months on this project, noted that the council owes it to taxpayers to make Ralph Engelstad Arena operations more efficient. He added that the council also needs to draw more money to the arena, which would benefit tenants such as the Thief River Falls Amateur Hockey Association.

Holmer replied that he wasn't opposed to that possibility, but he encouraged his fellow council members to determine a time to meet. After a discussion, the council agreed upon the tentative date of June 18.



(Continued from Page 1) listed on the company's payroll reports."

LiUNA also describes situations in which Latino workers are saying they've been paid less and treated differently than other employees doing similar work.

Lende said that when union workers talked to two Hispanic workers, Millennium found out and sent the workers back to Iowa.

LiUNA describes the situation as intimidation. "Millennium employees say that they have been subjected to verbal abuse and discouraged from talking to union representatives. They also say they were reassigned to lower-paying jobs on another project after meeting with a union organizer."

A quote from a LiUNA handout distributed Wednesday, states a Hispanic worker saying, "I've noticed certain things, but I don't know if it's because of racism, discrimination, or because we are Hispanic. I don't know, but I've noticed how it's different for Hispanic workers and American workers ... they give preference to the American workers - better pay, better treatment, everything is better for them than for the Hispanic workers."

Millennium Concrete
On Wednesday morning, The Times and Northern Watch contacted a representative of Millennium Concrete in Iowa to make sure

they had an opportunity to comment. The representative said they had "no comment."

McShane Construction
The Times and Northern Watch reached out to McShane Construction Wednesday morning and was told by Tom Beres, vice president of McShane Construction in the Rosemont office, that they don't believe the allegations are accurate and that they are doing all they can to make sure that wages are correct. They are doing certified payrolls on the job to comply with state prevailing wage laws. He said they will be formally responding to the allegations later.

(Certified payroll is a federal form, which is submitted weekly to the agency overseeing a government contract. The form lists

every employee, their wages, the benefits they're entitled to, the type of work they did, and the hours worked.)

The Digi-Key Project
The work being completed now is being done at the four-story product distribution center, which will provide an additional 2.2 million square feet of usable space to the company's existing Thief River Falls facilities. When completed, it will occupy an overall footprint of 1 million square feet. The initial investment is projected at more than \$300 Million.

Statement
Digi-Key issued the following statement Wednesday: "Digi-Key was very recently made aware of allegations involving a subcontractor working on the Digi-Key expansion project. We are working with our

general contractor to understand the issue and will continue to monitor the situation.

"We would like to emphasize that even according to Kevin Pranis, the Marketing Manager for LiUNA MN/ND, who is publicizing the allegations on behalf of LiUNA, Cement Masons Local 633, and the Northwest Minnesota Building Trades, the union action 'isn't against Digi-Key itself. Digi-Key does great stuff in the area. People are excited about this project.'

"We will continue to monitor the process with McShane and their subcontractors. We would not condone the activities suggested in the allegations and expect McShane and their subcontractors to fairly resolve any issues in question."

What does prevailing wage mean?

The Minnesota House Research Department provides the following explanation of What is Prevailing Wage. Prevailing wage, established in Minnesota in 1973, is a system under which contractors and subcontractors doing work on construction projects that are partly or entirely paid for with state funds are required to pay their employees no less than a particular amount determined by the Department of Labor and Industry to be the

"prevailing wage" for that particular employee's job and for the location where the work is being done.

The system contains both a minimum hourly wage requirement and requirements for overtime pay after the employee works the "prevailing hours" for the day or week, which can be a maximum of eight hours per day or forty hours a week. This differs from the regular state overtime requirements, which require over-

time only after 48 hours in a week and contain no daily overtime provision.

Who enforces Minnesota's prevailing wage laws?

These laws are enforced by the Department of Labor and Industry, except with respect to highway construction, in which case enforcement is the responsibility of the Department of Transportation.

Help decide future of city auditorium/Continued

(Continued from Page 1) just over a year after the old auditorium burned down, the new building was dedicated. The auditorium is a fine example of a public building that represents the distinctive characteristics of the Classical Moderne style. The first-floor lobby and the auditorium are significant interior spaces, with Art Deco motifs, including zigzag-and-sunburst, vertical fluting, and stylized floral patterns.

The newly built city auditorium continued to be the heart of activities in Thief River Falls for decades but, due to its lack of handicapped access, following passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act it became unusable for most public events.

At times, the city auditorium

has been home to and still bears evidence of being occupied by the Thief River Falls Police Department and jail, Courtroom, Thief River Falls Chamber of Commerce, City Council, City Clerk, Utilities Office, Department of Natural Resources, and other businesses and organizations, such as the Red Cross, municipal band and telephone company. During World War II, the auditorium was used as a local registration center for the selective service and for ceremonies for men entering military service. It still contains a basketball court with wooden floors and a balcony, a stage, and dressing rooms that were used by the high school and many other groups. It is still used for music and theater perform-

ances as well as basketball and volleyball. A door on the basement floor still bears the sign "Card Playing Rm." There's also a large meeting room in the basement. Expositions and conventions were also held in the auditorium.

About 10 years ago, the city traded ownership of the multi-faceted community center and "old arena" (both lying adjacent to the courthouse) with the county in exchange for Oakland Park. The county commissioners originally planned to raze both the auditorium and arena to make way for a courthouse addition and parking. Three years ago, the county board held a public hearing on plans for this courthouse addition and the community showed up in force to say they did not want either building torn down.

Since then, the county



has granted the Thief River Falls Amateur Hockey Association (TRFAHA) a 10-year lease for the old arena, securing that building's future for at least the next decade. TRFAHA is investing much time and a significant amount of money into this building to make it usable and sustainable into the future.

Frustrations at the border

Editorial opinion published under this heading is intended to stimulate thinking and discussion among our readers. At the meetings I've attended and from the letters printed in this newspaper and many others, area residents have made it abundantly clear they don't want to see a reduction in hours.

How does one communicate with someone when it goes in one ear and out the other? You can throw your hands up and quit, or you can be patient and continue to make an effort until they eventually hear your message. I urge Congressman Peterson and residents of northern Minnesota to continue to voice their opinions to CBP on this subject.

These reductions have had consequences for U.S. and Canadian citizens who rely on a working border for commerce and safety. I'm disappointed that CBP stated that it has not received any complaints. If we give them the benefit of the doubt, that statement may be a clerical mistake, but it does sound like the decision was made before the comments were received, and that smacks of arrogance. Again, if you're unclear on what we're trying to say, here it is: We don't want to see the hours of operation at these ports reduced.

The free flow of traffic and trade must be restored.

It's disappointing that even our Congressman can't seem to be heard by U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Their obstinance leaves one with the impression they're being obtuse or have already made up their mind.

In case you're planning to cross the U.S.-Canadian border in northern Minnesota, the hours of operation for the Lancaster Port were reduced from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. in the summer months; and the Roseau Port was reduced in hours of operation from 8 a.m. to midnight to 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. year round.

Last week, Congressman Collin Peterson, who has made repeated efforts to communicate the concerns of his constituents and proposed alternatives, said CBP continues to demonstrate its arrogance towards people living in rural areas. He noted that contrary to the existence of letters, and comments from town hall meetings, the Seattle Field Office reported that it had received "no complaints" - written, electronic or telephonic since the reduced hours went into effect.

Rural Reflections ... A letter to my brother, Dave

seems to be the spot where dry-land farming meets the sort of planting-harvest cycle typical of our area. We are never more than a few inches away from dust or mud and so I don't pray for rain or pray for it to stop. I just let God use his own best judgment. Just a few weeks ago, it was too cold and too wet to plant; last weekend the dust was already starting to fly and it was 85 degrees.

I will soon have cattle, Dave. About 10 years ago, I sold my own herd and started pasturing cattle for other people. It's a single-serving portion of cattle that lasts about six months. It's like being a cow grandpa, you get to have fun and enjoy raising cattle in the sunshine and then send them home for the winter with their parents. It's one of the best things I have ever done.

I look forward to our radio interviews, Dave. They are a consistent highlight to my week. I hope they are the same for you. Tell everyone hello,

shade structure over the cattle chute, palpation cage and squeeze chute. I built the structure this winter over at Stieger's then hauled it home in pieces where it awaits assembly.

The structure is four steels posts, each with an angled top. A cross-piece sits on top, although it does not look like a "T." The cross-piece is off-center with four feet to one side of the post and about 14 feet to the other. The 14 feet reach out and above the work area while the opposing four feet are there to balance the overhang. I plan to tension a chain from a hook at the end of the four-foot piece to the base. I will then connect the horizontal pieces with wooden purlins that will also support the shade fabric, which will prevent sun, but allow pass-through of rain. I have a mechanism planned so I can unroll the shade fabric for the summer and roll it up during the winter. It looks very similar to a truck box roll-tarp. This will prevent build-up of snow and potential collapse.

District seeks funds to provide extra assistance

Thief River Falls schools have applied for funds that will provide small group instruction to students who need additional assistance to gain skills in reading, math and behavioral skills, but don't fit within the guidelines for special education services.

Tuesday, May 29, Challenger Elementary School Principal Patrick Marolt and Franklin Middle School Principal Bob Wayne outlined the application for funds for ADSIS.

ADSI or Alternative Delivery of Specialized Instructional Services, is not a grant. It's state funding that comes in the form of state aid the year following expenses. The goal of ADSIS is to provide small group instruction to students who need additional assistance to gain essential skills in the areas of reading, math and behavior skills.

With the funds, Challenger Elementary School would create counselor and reading interventionists positions. At Franklin Middle School, the funds would make it possible to create positions for math interventionist, and reading.

Marolt and Wayne thanked Sara Olson for her direction and assistance in applying for the funds and developing the program. At Challenger, another position opens this spring with the announcement that Brian Loe, dean of students, was accepting a position in another school district. Instead of a dean of students, the position is being changed to that of counselor. Another retirement within the District, and flexibility of staff within the Media Center at Franklin Middle School, also makes this possible.

At Challenger Elementary School, the counselor would teach Second Step, an evidence-based program rooted in social-emotional learning that helps transform environments at schools. The counselor would also provide small-group counseling for identified students, facilitate between teacher and parent, provide playground supervision where many of the problems at the school come to light, attend SAT meetings and assist with the Positive Behavioral Interventions and

Supports.

The reading interventionist at the school would teach leveled literacy, provide small group instruction, monitor the progress of students, help with screening three times per year, communicate to teachers and parents and deliver professional development to grade levels.

At Franklin Middle School, the math interventionists would teach three sections of Math180 to identified students, teach three sections of the Do the Math program, and provide small group class sizes for identified students.

The reading interventionist would teach lower level Read180 with System 44 in classrooms, and provide small group class sizes for identified students.

Wayne and Marolt are excited about the opportunity to provide assistance to these students.

Bergstrom said he applauded the creativity and flexibility staff exhibited in putting this together.

Olson said the funds are available, and added it was mostly a matter of filling out the right boxes in the application. She said they could hear whether the proposal has been accepted any day.

Personnel

The Board of Education approved a contract with Kelly Weets as assistant principal at Lincoln High School. Weets has been serving as dean of students at the school. She recently completed course work required before becoming an assistant principal. She then had to be interviewed and hired for the position.

The Board of Education approved the amended phased retirement option contract with Jodi Bergman, payroll and benefits director. Initially the contract called for her to work 20 hours per week through Oct. 4, but now the contract calls for her to work up to 30 hours per week through Oct. 4.

The Board of Education established and posted 2019 summer positions. This is an annual action taken by the Board that allows for the hiring of personnel for buildings and grounds, summer food service, targeted services or summer school teachers, teachers at the Area Learning Center, and special education therapists and teachers.

The sport of pickleball is growing in Thief River Falls. Retirees have been introduced to it in retirement communities in the south during the winter months, and have come back to the area wanting to continue to play the game.

"I was glad to come back from Arizona, this spring, to find that pickleball is still going strong and even growing in our community," said Russ Christianson.

A group of interested senior citizens started playing last summer on the Northland College tennis courts. The group has grown to around 20, including several who drive in from Newfalden to play. Pickleball is currently being played in the National Guard Armory from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. on Mondays through Fridays. The group hopes to move outside when the weather cooperates. Legends Sporting Goods is now stocking pickleball equipment.

Pickleball uses a paddle, wiffleball, a net and has simple rules. It's one of the fastest growing sports in the

United States because it's easy to learn, and can be played by all ages. Two pickleball courts can fit on one tennis court using portable nets and boundary line tape.

The game combines elements of racquetball and tennis, and the scoring is similar to ping pong. A seven-foot area on either side of the net, called the kitchen, is a no-volley zone.

The game was first played in 1965 in Brainbridge, Wash., as a children's backyard game. There are several stories as to how the game got its strange name. One story tells about the family dog, Pickles, who kept chasing the game ball.

The local group plays four players to a game and have three portable nets set up. Both men and women play. Players rotate partners, unless they choose to sit one out.

"I enjoy the competition and don't even realize I'm exercising," said Sue Dupree.

"It's a good social time for me and I've made some new friends," said Marty Doppler.

"It's fun and addicting," added Marlene Lund.

Mark Mattson commented, "I just love this game, I could play it all day."

The benefits of playing pickleball are many, according to Health Prep, a condi-

tion focused health news and education website. "Pickleball: is a low impact workout easy on the joints, improves balance and stability, builds strength, improves eye-hand coordination, enhances agility and reaction time, increases social interaction, and boosts cardio vascular health."

Edie Brandli said, "It's a true workout. You don't feel like you're working hard."

The local group has received a grant from Thrivent Financial to purchase another net and to introduce the game to other senior citizens in the community.

An open house event, Pickleball for Seniors 55+, will be held on Tuesday,

June 11, from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the National Guard Armory (behind the Dairy Queen) in Thief River Falls. Interested retirees are encouraged to stop by and try out the available equipment, or just watch a game. Please wear gym shoes and come in the back (south) door of the armory. Local players will be on hand to demonstrate and explain the game.

Prowler tennis team falls in state consolation championship

Hibbing defeated Thief River Falls 4-3 to claim the Class A consolation championship Wednesday at the Reed-Sweatt Family Tennis Center in Minneapolis.

The match-up was a battle of the two northern-most schools competing in the

Class A state tournament, as well as the only two remaining public schools in the tournament. The match lived up to its billing as an unofficial Class A public school championship, with three of the seven matches decided by third set super tiebreakers.

"I think everyone went out there and competed their very best," said Head

Coach Fabian Tunberg. "Heat of the moment, everyone was out there grinding away. Parents were into it on both sides and that's what you want to see. When you get down to the state tournament, it's nothing like any other experience."

Thief River Falls defeated Hibbing 4-3 in the only regular season meeting between the teams. The two

duals followed a similar path, with the one decision going differently in the rematch, was the number one doubles match-up going from Thief River Falls in the first dual to Hibbing in the rematch.

The other difference between the duals was the use of a third set super tiebreaker to decide any match that required a third

set. If the teams had met in the championship side of the bracket, full third sets would have been used until one of the teams had clinched the dual meet victory.

Hibbing was the first to put points on the board as Dom Warzecha defeated Tucker Skime 6-2, 6-1 in the number three singles match.

Jack Onkka put the Prowlers on the board with a 6-2, 6-3 win over Nic Cicchi in the number four singles match.

Cole Gillespie won the first set of the number one singles match against Hibbing's Carter Anderson 6-0. He fell 5-7 in the second set, before righting the ship for a 10-7 win in the super tiebreaker to give the Prowlers a 2-1 lead.

The next match in the books was a 6-4, 7-5 win by Camden Broadwell to put the Prowlers up 3-1.

With its back against the wall Hibbing clawed its way to wins in all three doubles matches to claim the dual. The comeback started with the number two doubles team of Isaac Hildebrand and Jack Grzybowski, who rallied after dropping the first set by a 6-2 margin to Thief River Falls seniors Ethan Janisch and Aiden Martell, to win the second set 6-3, followed by an 11-9 tiebreaker win.

Thief River Falls' number three doubles team of Rhett and Reece Janisch dropped the first set in their match against Hibbing's Luke Lundell and Brandon Butkovich

by a score of 6-2. They rallied to force a second set tiebreak, which they lost 8-6, to fall in straight sets.


With the dual tied 3-3, the Hibbing duo of Joe Dwyer and Mark Borland rallied from a 7-6 (7-5) first set tiebreaker loss to Noah Rupprecht and Dylan Hahn to win the second set via tiebreaker 7-6 (7-5) to set up the third set super tiebreaker, which they won 10-8.
