Northland Community and Technical College received good news on two fronts this past week. The college, along with its five other partner agencies, has been awarded a National Science Foundation grant in the amount of \$7 million to facilitate the formation of the National Center for Autonomous Technologies, which will be hosted on the NCTC Aerospace site in Thief River Falls. The college was also visited by State Chancellor Devinder Malhotra who announced the availability of \$8 million in workforce development scholarships in the Minnesota State system, of which some students from Northland will be recipients.

## NCTC awarded \$7 million National Science Foundation grant

Northland Community and Technical College, along with five other partner agencies, has been awarded a National Science Foundation grant in the amount of \$7 million; the largest grant ever awarded to Northland. This grant will facilitate the formation of the National Center for Autonomous Technologies to be hosted on Northland's Aerospace site in Thief River Falls. Northland will partner with St. Cloud State University, Marine Advanced Technology

Education Inspiration for Innovation, Center for Advanced Automotive Technology, National Geospatial Technology Center of Excellence, and the Minnesota State Transportation Center of Excellence to educate and promote autonomous technologies throughout the United States.

The National Center for Autonomous Technologies will join the National Science Foundation's large circle of Advanced Technological Education Centers.

"We will build upon the work of several other NSF ATE program investments including Northland's DRONETECH programs, MATE, CAAT, and GeoTech. These, in addition to other investments, will contribute to the NCAT meeting the rapid developments in autonomous technologies," said Jon Beck, Northland Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) instructor and NCAT principal investigator.

Autonomous technology is already woven into the fabric of everyday life from

autonomous guided agricultural equipment to household vacuums that are able to independently navigate the living room. "Advanced vehicle technology is here. The NCAT will create the infrastructure to develop skilled technicians who will build the workforce of today and tomorrow to meet industry demands," said Christopher Hadfield, director of the Minnesota State Transportation Center for Excellence. "In two years, 60% of all new vehicles will have autonomous technol-

ogy components."

The National Center for Autonomous Technologies will focus on air, land, and sea autonomous technologies: unmanned aircraft systems, connected automated vehicles, and unmanned underwater vehicles.

"Our mission has four main tenets," said Curtis Zoller, Northland associate dean of aerospace and agriculture, "to educate the educators, to promote student involvement, engage the

## Chancellor announces workforce scholarships available at NCTC



Minnesota State Chancellor Devinder Malhotra traveled to Northland Community and Technical College in Thief River Falls on Tuesday to announce the availability of \$2,500 scholarships.

Minnesota State Chancellor Devinder Malhotra traveled to Northland Community and Technical College in Thief River Falls Tuesday to announce the availability of \$8 million in workforce development scholarships in the Minnesota State system.

In 2017, the Legislature appropriated \$1 million for a pilot program to fund scholarships to help attract students into high-demand career areas experiencing a workforce shortage, such as advanced manufacturing, agriculture, health care and information technology. Two more were added this year - early childhood and transportation. With the success

of the pilot program, the 2019 Legislature approved an expansion of the program, which includes an increase of annual funding from \$1 million to \$2 million, and \$6 million in the following year.

Malhotra congratulated NCTC on its recent announcement that it was part of an effort that received a \$7 million National Science Foundation grant. It's extremely rare for a college to receive a NSF grant. He said he was justifiably proud of the faculty, staff and programs that were instrumental in getting the grant.

Malhotra's purpose for visiting NCTC, however, was to help raise awareness about the challenges, immediacy, and urgency of addressing workforce challenges in the state of Minnesota and its communities. He said he was under no illusion that \$8 million will solve all of their problems or workforce shortages of Minnesota, but said this was a catalyst to build partnerships - with businesses, K-12 and philanthropic agencies and organizations. "If we want to foster, nourish and grow the talent Minnesota needs, we can't do that ourselves."

Research indicates that 75% of emerging jobs will re-

quire some post-secondary credential. Malhotra said Minnesota State Colleges will be a major player in preparing students for tomorrow's jobs.

Malhotra said the college system, however, has to understand what students need. Students face many challenges to their access. Poverty, he said, for example, is not a choice, but it is a barrier; so too is marginalization. "It is our responsibility to make sure those barriers are removed."

This scholarship program is one small effort in that regard.

The scholarship program has many benefits beyond the money. Malhotra described it as a social mobility strategy because it helps put students on a path to higher education, better jobs, and economic stability. "I view these workforce scholarships not just aimed at workforce but at strengthening communities" because 80 percent of students after graduation will stay within the state of Minnesota and communities in which they got their education.

He said he now wants to make sure the word gets out, so that those who thought college was not possible,

## Two county ditches realigned

The Pennington County Board approved realigning portions of two county ditches at its meeting Tuesday, July 9. Commissioners also approved abandoning a portion of one of those ditches.

County Board approved realigning a portion of CD 70 near Petro Pumper in Thief River Falls. The realignment will enable the ditch to move water south of True North Equipment (formerly known as Evergreen Implement). County Engineer Mike Flaagan said the ditch will then meet up with County State Aid Highway 16 (commonly known as the bypass) and head south. The north end of CD 70 will be unaffected by this project.

Commissioners also approved realigning CD 1 to a natural channel south of CSAH 7 and Sanford Health. Flaagan described it as a natural, windy channel. The ditch will then cross Highway 32 and become parallel with the highway.

In the event of inclement weather, the service will be held at the Warren-Alvarado-Oslo High School auditorium.

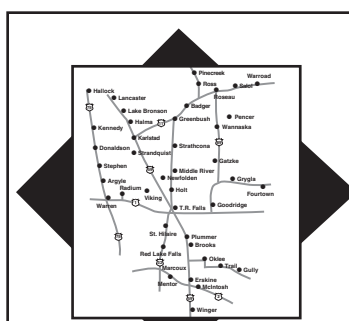

**Hallock Council reviews audit**

Hallock - "The Hallock City Council received the 2018 audit report from Tracee Bruggeman of Brady Martz in Thief River Falls.

"Bruggeman pointed out

the statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances, which showed a deficit in the general fund of \$16,692 and showed an ending ongoing balance of \$748,646.

"In the general fund, revenues were \$1,498,823. Expenditures were \$191,722 for general government, \$270,484 for public safety (which includes fire, police and civil defense), \$195,723 for public works, \$158,895 for culture and recreation, \$13,482 for community development, \$29,339 for airport and \$655,870 for capital outlay. Total expenditures were \$1,515,515.

"Cash flows showed the water fund having a balance of \$51,898, sewer \$68,827, gas distribution \$147,982 and Economic Development Association a loss of \$13,693." - *Kittson County Enterprise, July 10, 2019, by Margie Holmgren*

## Level 3 sex offender moves

A Level 3 sex offender has moved elsewhere in Thief River Falls.

Steven Glen Bruyere, 60, moved Tuesday, June 25 to a home in the 1000 block of Main Ave. N., according to information provided by the Thief River Falls Police Department. Bruyere was previously homeless and had listed his address as elsewhere in the city. In cities the size of Thief River Falls and in smaller cities, the Minnesota Department of Corrections doesn't provide the specific address of homes where Level 3 sex offenders



live.

Level 3 sex offenders are classified as those sex offenders who are most likely to re-offend. Bruyere has a history of sexual conduct and contact with girls. Contact included sexual touching. In one instance, Bruyere gained compliance through bribery. Conduct included taking sexually-explicit photos and videos of the victims as well as showing pornography to one victim. He knew the victims.

Bruyere is not wanted by law enforcement and has served the sentence imposed on him by the court.

Bruyere has black hair and brown eyes. He is 5 feet, 8 inches tall and weighs 299 pounds.

# Clarington enters NFL Supplemental Draft



Northland standout tight end Devonaire Clarington, left, entered the NFL supplemental draft Wednesday but was not drafted by any of the 32 teams. He is now an unrestricted free agent.

Northland standout tight end/wideout Devonaire Clarington of Miami, Fla., is one of five college football players who have received eligibility for the 2019 NFL Supplemental Draft, which was conducted Wednesday.

Unlike the regular college draft each April, the supplemental draft is a different operation — one that's not on TV — that is open to college prospects whose statuses (often academic- or eligibility-related) have changed in the late spring and early summer following the completion of the college draft.

Along with Clarington, players eligible for this year's supplemental draft were Washington State defensive back Jalen Thompson, West Virginia wide receiver Marcus Simms, Syracuse linebacker Shyheim Cullen, and St. Francis (Ill.) defensive back Bryant Perry.

Thompson was the only player of the five to be drafted in Wednesday's supplemental draft. He was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the fifth round.

The draft was conducted over email with all 32 NFL teams and monitored by the league office. Teams were to bid on players by stating which players, if any, they want to draft and the round in which they would be willing to take them.

If a team is awarded a player, it loses a corresponding pick the following year. In this case, the pick takes the place of the Cardinals' fifth-round selection in the 2020 NFL Draft. The Cardinals had two fifth-rounders after getting an extra one from Miami in the Josh Rosen trade.

Clarington and the three other players who were not selected can now become free agents and sign with any

team.

According to Yahoo Sports, back in 2015, Clarington was a four-star Rivals recruit out of the Miami area who chose Texas over his local Hurricanes, Notre Dame, Michigan, USC and half of the SEC teams — including Alabama. He never suited up for the Longhorns following academic issues and transferred initially to Blinn (Texas) Junior College before ending up at Northland Community & Technical College last season.

In 11 games with Northland last season, Clarington registered team highs in catches (48), receiving yards (916) and TD catches (11). He also rushed three times for 24 yards (long of 18) and completed two of five passes for 20 yards.

Clarington is listed at 6-

foot-7 and 235 pounds, but he's believed to be just a bit smaller than that. His long road to this point — with very little football the past few seasons — makes him a tricky evaluation.

Clarington's athleticism and large frame make him a fascinating project for an NFL team willing to invest with patience for something down the road.

Since the NFL instituted the supplemental draft in 1977, there have been a total of 45 players drafted. However, only eight have been selected in the past two years. The last first-round supplemental pick was Duke's Dave Brown in 1992, and there have been only two second-round picks — Josh Gordon in 2012 and Tony Hollings in 2003 — since 1998.

## Avoid hitting loons while boating

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is reminding boaters to watch for loons as part of their season-long safety procedures.

Watercraft are a significant cause of loon mortality. Loons frequently nest and rear their young in areas where boats move at higher speeds.

Loon chicks are not able to fly until they are more than two months old; they're also unable to dive for safety as mature loons and other birds can.

Mature loons are heavy birds, enabling them to dive as deep as 250 feet to search for food. They can stay underwater for up to five minutes.

Loons in Minnesota range throughout the busiest boating areas of the state, inhabiting lakes across almost all of northern, central and east-

ern Minnesota.

Other facts about loons:  
• Minnesota has more loons (roughly 12,000) than any other state except Alaska.

• Loons can fly more than 75 miles per hour.

• The red in the loon's eye helps it to see under water.

• Scientists think loons can live for 30 years or more. In addition to fast-moving boats, threats to loons include human disturbance and pollutants such as lead and mercury. The DNR monitors loon populations with the help of volunteers to improve understanding of what our state bird needs to maintain a strong, healthy presence here.

**A letter to my brother, Dave**

It is one of those dreary days that make productivity almost impossible. The last two days produced a lot of rain. It locked in pasture growth, which is really great. The glory of needed rain is now past and it is just plain cloudy.

I still have some nice memories from my trip to Carrington, Dave. I especially enjoyed sitting in the backyard of your home with you and Mary. It was just nice to have such peace and quiet to visit before I headed back home. It's funny, but I used to really enjoy driving with the windows down, but now it kind of adds to the fatigue. Maybe I will have to get my truck's air conditioning in better shape before my next trip.

Back at our little farm, we continue to experiment. I don't fertilize our pasture very often; however, this year's soil samples showed a need for soil supplement. Fertilizer prices are pretty high so I decided I would try liquid fertilizer. I've always wanted to try liquid fertilizer and this seemed like a good year to not only bring more nitrogen to the grass, but to reduce the Ph of our soil. This will be a mostly foliar application, which means it will enter through the green portion of the plant instead of through the ground like dry fertilizer. I guess our next soil samples will tell me if this was a good choice.

Another new wrinkle to cattle farming this year has been the use of a monoculture. I have always wanted to check the cattle more completely in the morning before work, but I don't like disturbing them. I tried my drone, but the noise bothered them. I have never been able to line up binoculars properly with my eyes, so I decided to try a monocu-


lar/spotting scope. It works fantastic and gives me a chance to take a quick peek at the cows from the road. It was \$10 and made a real difference for me.

The Pennington County Fair is next week. I will emcee the TRF Beards and Beers Festival, which is a highlight to my summer. This is such a crazy quilt of people that makes for one really fun afternoon and gives me great ideas for another column. County fairs are the stuff that makes those who left the farm come back to raise families, so it's important to keep these institutions strong. It is also the turning point to the summer for me as we are only a few weeks and one or two back-to-school sales away from autumn.

That last sentence either made readers a little nostalgic or they quit reading, Dave. I suspect you and I have similar views on summer, so I hope you kept on reading. Thanks again for the visit and tell everyone hello.

(Continued from Page 1) workforce and community, and to act as an education hub for autonomous technology across the country.”

The National Center for Autonomous Technologies will construct professional development workshops for educators and industry professionals and promote and provide support to encour-

age more engagement in STEM and autonomous technologies in secondary and post-secondary education, particularly in underserved areas. In addition, the NCAT aims to involve workforce and community stakeholders, to help identify and solve everyday issues with autonomous technology.

“Northland has driven innovation in autonomous technology education for almost a decade,” said Beck. “Autonomous technologies will transform the way society lives, works, and travels. The NCAT will provide significant advancements in

technical education required to sustain the United States as a leader in autonomous technologies.”

“We are very appreciative to the National Science Foundation for awarding this exceptionally large and prestigious grant to North-

land and our partner institutions,” said Northland’s President Dr. Dennis Bona. “I’m also extremely proud of our Aerospace team for demonstrating their expertise in autonomous technology, as well as the tremendous effort they put

into preparing for this grant. Receiving this grant will further Northland’s national reputation for aerospace education and establish us as a leader in this field of study.”

(Continued from Page 1) discover there is a path; and those who didn’t think there were resources, there are resources.

Malhotra sees the scholarship program as a catalyst for change - not just for students, but communities. He provided several examples of businesses where there is high demand for an educated workforce adding to the scholarships, and philanthropic individuals or foundations, adding to the scholarships because they see the value and importance of removing barriers.

He said he was aware of at least two Foundations paying tuition for students to attend two-year colleges in their communities.

But Malhotra sees another important partner in the conversation about access to higher education - K-12 schools. Malhotra said fostering and encouraging the hopes and dreams of stu-

dents has as much to do with access to college as money. These scholarships, he said, help Minnesota State Colleges, to engage families and students in discussions that allow them to see a path forward to college. “The doors of hope and opportunity open a little wider” with these scholarships, said Malhotra.

**The Scholarships**  
Through the pilot program, there were eight scholarships available at NCTC. Next year, there will be 18, and the following year, 26. Malhotra said the Legislature saw the benefit of the scholarships through the pilot program, and he thanked the Legislature and Gov. Walz’s administration for their support.

Lars Dyrud, executive director of Northland Foundation, shared a few words about the local impact. The message is clear, he said, Minnesota needs people in these fields now and NCTC will help them get there. An online application will get graduating seniors signed up at nctcfoundation.com. There are 26 scholarships for \$2,500 per student available. Eight have already

been awarded, but 18 more will be awarded before school starts in August.

Dyrud is also encouraged about the local impact. He said he was contacted last week by an ag-related business leader who stated they have trouble finding an adequately educated workforce and wondered if there was a way to help. Dyrud said there is a way businesses can take advantage of the marketing and message being put out. Businesses, he said, can add funds to the scholarships in their career areas and build on the funds the state already provided, thus making the rewards even higher, and creating an even greater pull on students in the community.

Dr. Dennis Bona, president of NCTC, explained these scholarships are first dollar scholarships, which means they are applied to the tuition bill first, before federal and state grant aid. He said it’s an incredible opportunity. In a sense, it allows students to use some of their grants and aid to help pay for things like transportation and day care, which can be significant barriers to education.

Malhotra said preliminary data from the pilot program show that the likelihood of students completing their education by getting their certificate or degrees increasing to 90%. He said by comparison, this was 20 to 25 percent higher than the general population.

### First-hand experience

Maddie Stewart, a Lincoln High School graduate who participated in the PSEO program and then had enough credits to complete her degree at NCTC in one year, now attends the University of Minnesota at Crookston. She is majoring in agriculture education and minoring in animal science. She said that when she opened the letter saying she was a recipient of one of these scholarships, it eliminated the stress of worrying about how she was going to pay for her education. More than that, she said it helped give her the focus and motivation to finish and dream about another degree program in agriculture that will help her educate future students about the importance of agriculture and opportunities in the workforce.

# Two county ditches realigned/Continued

(Continued from Page 1) Jesme said commissioners abandoned an unneeded portion of CD 1. That abandoned area will be filled in as part of the estimated \$4.6 million Thief River Falls Westside Flood Damage Reduction Project.

In an interview with the Northern Watch, Jesme noted that the soon-to-be unneeded section of CD 70, located along Highway 59, has been transferred to the City of Thief River Falls contingent on the project moving forward.

This fall, the RLWD plans to let bids for the project that will address drainage issues in CD 70 on the west side of Thief River Falls. Construction is expected to continue into 2020. Currently, CD 70 drains through the northwestern portion of the city, past Arctic Cat and Digi-Key, and into the Red Lake River.

County Board approved the ditch realignments and abandonment after a public

hearing minutes earlier. Eleven people attended the hearing.

Jared Peterick, who owns property in the benefitted area, was among those who attended. He told commissioners that his property doesn’t benefit from the project. He said there are no drainage issues on his property.

Jesme replied that the public hearing was being held for the possible realignments of both ditches and partial abandonment of CD 1. He said the benefits hearing was held May 23.

Jesme’s office has received numerous calls from landowners in the benefitted area of CD 70. The county provided the names of the benefitting property owners to the RLWD, said Jesme, who noted that his office isn’t in the position to change the benefitted area. He noted the County Board would have to change that designation in a separate order.

“Historically, that area tends to flood,” said Commissioner Neil Peterson, who noted water slowly drains near the intersection of Highways 1 and 59.

Flaagan said a lot of business owners and landowners were concerned about flooding there. In particular, Flaagan referred to businesses north of Petro Pumper and also along Highway 59. Pennington County and the City of Thief River Falls then petitioned the RLWD for the project on behalf of those individuals.

Peterick replied that he wouldn’t try pushing off a project on taxpayers if he were having drainage issues on his property. “I just don’t get it,” he said. “Wouldn’t that be my responsibility?”

Flaagan replied that Peterick’s property was within the benefitted area of CD 70. The benefitted area is responsible for maintenance and improvement costs for the ditch.

Commissioner Don

Jensen pointed out that the county acts as the fiscal agent for the ditch, which belongs to the benefitted area.

Peterick remained unsatisfied with statements by county leaders and Jesme. Jesme reiterated the reason for the public hearing and encouraged Peterick to meet with him at his office about the matter.

Peterick replied that he is a voter and the County Board had a right to hear his complaints.

The bullfighters are the ones in the rink who get up close and personal with the bulls and help the bull riders out of harm’s way. This job takes a great deal of skill and quickness. This year’s bullfighters are Cooper Waln, Wayne Ratley and Lucas Teodoro. Spectators will see a lot of them.

Calling all the action taking place in the ring will be Clint Adkins. Adkins has announced PBR events since the late 1990s and moved to the Built Ford Tough Series in 2006.

A lot of different elements must come together to make a bull ride successful. One of the most important elements of a successful bull ride are the bulls. Chad Berger Bucking Bulls are considered among the best, and they will be at Thunder

on Hooves in Thief River Falls. Chad Berger Bucking Bulls were named PBR Stock Contractor of the Year in 2007, 2008, 2009, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Thunder on Hooves spectators have filled the grandstand every year since it began - and for a good reason. It’s one of the best shows in the nation.

The always popular Mutton Busting competition for young bull ride fans will also be a part of this year’s event.

# USDA extends reporting deadline

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is extending the deadline to file crop acreage reports for agricultural producers in Minnesota impacted by flooding and heavy moisture. The new July 22 deadline applies to reporting spring-seeded crops to USDA’s Farm Service Agency county offices and federal crop insurance agents.

“Agriculture operations throughout the state have been hit hard by heavy rains and flooding that have affected their operations,” said Joe Martin, FSA state executive director in Minnesota. “The deadline extension provides more flexibility for producers who experienced planting and field work delays.”

Filing a timely crop acreage report is important to maintaining eligibility for USDA conservation, disaster assistance, safety net, crop insurance and farm loan programs. A crop acreage report documents all crops and their intended uses and is

an important part of record-keeping for your farm or ranch.

Producers filing reports with FSA county offices are encouraged to set up an appointment before visiting the office. Acreage reports from producers in Minnesota who set up appointments before the July 22 deadline are considered timely filed, even if the appointment occurs after the deadline.

The following exceptions apply to acreage reporting:

- If the crop has not been planted by the reporting date, the acreage must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after planting is completed.
- If a producer acquires additional acreage after the above acreage reporting date, the acreage must be reported no later than 30 calendar days after purchasing or acquiring the lease. Appropriate documentation must be provided to the county office.

“Even though the dead-

line has been extended, I encourage producers to contact their local FSA office today to schedule an appointment to report acreage,” Martin said.

### Other USDA Efforts to Help Producers

USDA is taking additional steps to help producers across the country, including:

- Updating the haying and grazing date for producers who have planted cover crops on prevented plant acres;
- Offering special sign-ups through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program for assistance to plant cover crops; and
- Extending the deadline to report prevented plant acres in certain places.



