City Hall heating system failing

Geothermal heating loops are leaking

The Thief River Falls City Council declared an emergency Tuesday, Oct. 22 in order to fix the heating system at City Hall.

Citing unforeseen circumstances that may jeopardize human life or property, the

council directed Public Works Director Mark Borseth to seek quotes to purchase gas boilers and chillers. It was expected that the above equipment would be used in conjunction with the portion of the heating system that remains operational.

Borseth estimated it would cost about \$40,000 to purchase gas boilers and chillers. He believed it would cost \$50,000 to drill a new well field in the gravel parking lot north of City Hall if the council wished to

instead replace the current system. Borseth was expected to bring quotes to either an upcoming Public Works Committee meeting or the council meeting Tuesday, Nov. 5.

The depot, which was remodeled to serve as City Hall in 1997, uses a ground-source geothermal system. Borseth said the system uses 48 wells under the City Hall parking lot. As part of his daily inspection, building maintenance worker Roy Fisher noticed the system's glycol level was down. He

added fluid to the system and logged the amounts added each time. Borseth indicated that 75 gallons of glycol leaked into the ground over the course of one-and-a-half weeks.

A pressure test determined half of the system or two loops were leaking. Borseth said more than 300,000 Btus are needed to heat and cool the building. Right now, the system is capable of producing 260,000 Btus.

"The issue tonight is the time of the year," Borseth

said.

Council members Curt Howe and Mike Lorenson noted the possibility that the remainder of the system may fail.

"This could happen in a month," said Howe. "This could happen in three days."

Lorenson looked up the life expectancy of geothermal systems, finding it to be 25 to 30 years. He said, "We're in the gambling zone right now."

Fabian requests disaster declaration

Rep. Dan Fabian, R-Roseau, and other House Republicans sent a letter to Gov. Walz Wednesday, Oct. 23, requesting an executive order declaring a flood emergency to deal with the extensive flooding causing financial and logistical challenges for Minnesota farmers.

The letter also requested the administration's help in working with the federal government to seek a secretarial disaster designation through the United States Department of Agriculture, and a presidential disaster declaration. North Dakota Gov. Doug Bergum signed a similar executive order earlier this week.

"Minnesota farmers are struggling, and we need to do all we can to help them," said Fabian. "This fall's flooding caused by excessive rainfall has created huge problems for almost everyone in northwest Minnesota. I am hoping that these disaster declarations will help to ease financial burdens on individuals and local governments."

An executive order, paired with the federal declarations, would give farmers access to financial assistance as well as assist with emergency road repairs.

Family grows with changes in dairy

A picture that appeared online and in The Times last year of a young boy putting ear muffs on his dairy calves sparked intense interest. That young boy was Curtis Griffin, the son of Ryan and Karen Griffin who live on a working farm near Thief River Falls.

At the age of 9, Curtis is now officially old enough to join the ranks of 4-Hers in Pennington County and show cattle as a junior member of the National Association Shows. He has also

taken a more active role on the family farm.

First, what happened to those calves with ear muffs on?

Before we get into that, we have to set the scene.

About six and one-half years ago, Ryan and Karen Griffin helped purchase a heifer calf as an investment for their children, and as Ryan said, it would also serve as a teaching tool that emphasized the values of hard work and commitment.

Gem, a 2-year-old Red and White cow that Curtis showed this year, is a daughter of that purchased ani-



mal. Gem was recently named honorable mention grand champion of the International Red and White Junior Show at the World Dairy Expo in Madison, Wis. Gem is the same cow that won grand champion at Northwest Dairy Day in Pennington County, supreme and grand champion at the Pennington County Fair, and grand champion of the Midwest Fall National Red and White Junior Show held during the Minnesota State Fair Open Class Dairy Show.

Yes, I said the kids' cows. How do they monetize its success? Karen explained they've had a lot of interest in embryos from Gem and her offspring.

Ryan said the interest has come from other dairy breeders throughout the U.S., Australia and the United Kingdom.

Back to those calves in the picture: Well, one of the calves from last winter's picture is also doing well. Joyous was second and first Bred and Owned Winter Heifer Calf at the Midwest Fall National Red and White Show. Bred and owned is

Lancaster Fire Dept. awarded grant

Lancaster Volunteer Fire Department is one of 10 organizations to receive a \$5,000 donation through the Bayer Cereal Experts Grain for Good Sweepstakes.

The Lancaster Volunteer Fire Department was designated by Brady Diamond of Lancaster. Diamond was one of 10 entrants chosen to direct a donation to the organization of his choice.

"I'm a member of the fire department and know how

much it costs to upgrade equipment and buy gear for new firefighters," said Diamond. "We're a really small community and rely on donations to make these purchases. That's why I nominated the Lancaster Volunteer Fire Department to receive a donation through the Grain for Good Sweepstakes."

The Lancaster Volunteer Fire Department is comprised of 27 members and

This gear helps keep us safe on the front lines and provides protection against cancer-causing agents that

Northland Band and Honor Band to perform

On Nov. 7 at 7 p.m. in the Northland Community and Technical College Theatre in Thief River Falls, instrumental performers from throughout the area will take the stage to entertain with a variety of music.

Meat Balls Supreme
1 pound ground steak
1/4 pound fresh pork
1 egg
1 tablespoon cornstarch
1 medium sized onion, minced
1/2 cup milk, scalded
Salt and pepper
1/8 teaspoon allspice
1/8 teaspoon nutmeg
1/8 teaspoon ginger

Grind meat very fine, beat egg slightly and add with milk and cornstarch to meat mixture. Mix well. Add rest of ingredients; beat thoroughly until very light, then form into small balls. Brown in butter, simmer slowly until done, adding a little water, if necessary. When done, remove meat balls, add more butter to drippings, add flour and brown, then add enough water to make a medium thick gravy. Season with salt and pepper and add meat balls. These meat balls may be prepared several hours before serving, as they are just as delicious when reheated.

Kittson Healthcare flu vaccine delayed
Hallock - "Kittson Healthcare in Hallock is limiting its influenza vaccine distribution to high-risk individuals until November.

"The facility was planning several flu shot clinics last week in the county until it received word that the additional supply wouldn't arrive until Friday, Oct. 18."

"A few years ago, the clinic faced a similar problem when pharmaceutical companies had a manufacturing problem when creating the influenza vaccine. But this year, manufacturing isn't the issue nor is there a shortage of the vaccine, County Public Health Director Cindy Urbaniak said."

"As it has a limited amount on hand, officials at Kittson Healthcare made the decision Wednesday, Oct. 16 to hold the vaccine for high-risk individuals, including those with heart disease; a history of stroke, cancer, respiratory issues, diabetes or neurological disease; pregnant women; and children under the age of 5.

"The clinic received a shipment of vaccine Friday, Oct. 18, but that was prioritized for nursing residents who haven't been vaccinated yet, Urbaniak said."

"The clinic had enough vaccine doses available for the Oct. 9 walk-in flu shot clinic in Hallock and vaccinated 200 people, she said."

Why voting “Yes” and “Yes” matters

To the Editor:

Perhaps you had a chance to read the letters in favor of the two questions for the Red Lake Falls School District referendum written by the Lafayette High School principal and superintendent. I'd like to share with you why not just educators, but parents AND community members should also be in favor of both proposals.

A “Yes” vote on the first question seems easy to understand. Renewal of the operating referendum will fund our teachers, bus drivers, para educators, books, equipment – all the people and things that make our school work. Of course, we want to pay the teachers who teach our children and educate the next generation that will keep Red Lake Falls going. But a “No” vote on question 2 would send the message that we want them to teach in crowded rooms, with hectic schedules that jostle them and students between the combo gym/cafeteria and with noise distractions from neighboring ‘rooms’ without actual walls. How can they be expected to teach and reach children effectively with such working conditions? A “Yes” vote on question 2 says to them, ‘we highly respect what you do and recognize that you deserve basic ‘amenities,’ like four walls to effectively teach our children.”

What does a “Yes/Yes” vote mean to the students? It means we understand kids come in the doors at all levels. Some need more help than others in various areas, some are comprehending things their classmates aren't grasping yet. More importantly, it means we understand that their educational needs vary. It means we understand more classrooms are needed so classes aren't overcrowded, so all students at all levels and paces of learning can get the attention they need. “Yes” means that we support the need for special education classrooms that give the space to learn to those with specific education requirements. It means we as a community are behind the notion that some kids are gifted and we should have programming supporting those needs as well.

Did you know that currently, many kids who want to learn a musical instrument have to take lessons in the outer doorwell areas – you know, that frigid area between outside and inside doors? How conducive to learning can that be? Trying to explore music and all that brings to young lives, while shivering through music lessons! With no dedicated art space, the ability to learn through art exploration is limited to what can be stored in the coveted storage space or brought to students on the art cart. Are art and music such ‘extra curricul-ars’ that supporting a space for these is outlandish? People have been using art and music to express themselves longer than we have had the written word. Art and music are not ‘extras’ but are integral to all of our lives. For some kids, it's one of the few ways they are able to express themselves!

And now on to the biggie: What does supporting a new gymnasium space actually get us? Why do we need both a gym and a cafeteria (like almost every other school in America)? If the idea that your child or grandchild is eating meals every day in a sweat filled room that just saw dozens of kids run, fall, sweat, perhaps bleed from falls, and bounce dirty balls around doesn't make YOU want to skip lunch, perhaps the notion that staff could SAVE precious and copious amounts of time and money if they didn't have to set up and take down tables and chairs for breakfast AND lunch every single school day. That time could be better spent on educating, planning for programming needs, or reaching students who are struggling. Not to mention the ability to use a gym for indoor recess when northern Minnesota experiences those sub-zero temps that keep everyone inside for days on end! Of all locations that might need an indoor recess option for inclement weather, this corner of the U.S. sees more than enough days where outside play is not healthy to warrant an investment like a separate gym and cafeteria.

Speaking of investment, what an opportunity for our small town! Growth is good for cities like Red Lake Falls. Not only would this referendum benefit students and teachers at the school, it benefits homeowners. The value added to homes by a better school will allow Grandma and Grandpa to get more for their house when they decide to sell their home to move in with their kids. When Digi-Key finishes that expansion, an updated school will draw in those families with school-age children. Stunting that growth now by not investing in the school will send them to Thief River Falls or Crookston. We owe it to ourselves and to the community to invest now before the expansion is completed.

I've seen members of this community pour into fundraising events and give willingly to help a neighbor out, support a family with medical issues, raise funds for swimming pool fixes and the like. This is another such ‘event’ – but this time, it's for your kids, my kids, your grandchildren, your nieces and nephews – the people too young to know what to ask for, too young to arrange an event for themselves. Be their voice. On Tuesday, Nov. 5, 2019, let's build a brighter future that everyone in this district deserves by voting Yes on Question 1 and Yes on Question 2!





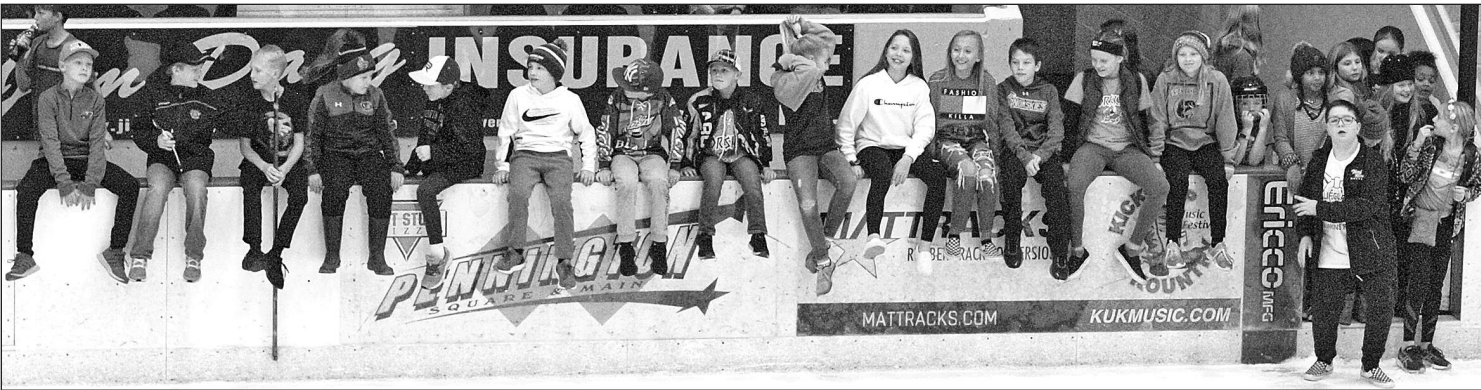

Prowlers' season ends with road playoff loss

Thief River Falls exited the Section 8AAA playoffs Tuesday night following a 33-7 setback at the hands of top-seeded Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton at DGF High School in Glyndon.

“Hard to say goodbye to this group of seniors,” said Thief River Falls Head Coach Bryce Lingen. “They really worked hard and have laid a great foundation for next year’s team and beyond. The fight they showed, along with the entire team, day in and day out was very special.”

Thief River Falls, which fell to 0-9 with the loss, would have needed a lot to go right to have any chance at an upset and early on, the Prowlers caught a break when DGF failed to convert a fourth down at midfield on its opening drive.

DGF was drawn offsid es on what would have been Thief River Falls’ first offensive play of the game. The Prowlers coughed up the football on their next play and DGF took advantage of the field position with scoring drive that culminated with 6-yard touchdown run by Justin Wang.

DGF added another score in the first quarter, on a 2-yard run by Carter Steen.

Late in the second quarter, Cade Sogge scored on a six-yard run to make it 20-0 in favor of the Rebels.

The Prowlers responded with their best drive of the game, reaching the DGF 30 with key receptions by Gunner Zutz and Zach Praska. The Prowlers’ Hail Mary throw was batted away in the end zone on the final play of the half.

“I thought we battled hard the first half,” Lingen said. “Kids laid it on the line which we knew they would. Probably should have been a

13-0 game or 20-7, but that is football, we didn’t convert on a few key opportunities.”

(Continued from Page 1) defined as the exhibitor being the breeder, first and continuous owner of the animal.

While Joyous and Gem definitely come from good stock, success doesn't come without hard work.

As mentioned earlier, the Griffins looked at the purchase as an investment for the kids, but to also provide their children with an education of what it takes to live on a farm, even if it means putting ear muffs on calves.

The Griffins believe farming teaches kids a lot of things - where their food comes from, responsibility, how to care for animals, life skills, safety skills, the life cycle, a greater appreciation and awareness of weather, problem solving skills, and that hard work results in rewards.

The Griffins have two other children on the farm - Evelyn, 7, and Agnes, 4. As Curtis has grown into new

responsibilities, so too has Evelyn. Agnes is a little young, but manages to provide some much needed entertainment on occasion. Karen and Ryan eventually hope all their children will learn the important lessons living on a farm.

Curtis has grown from a youth who only appears to show animals to one who actually shows animals, participates in the decision-making process, feeding, cleaning, caring for in general, and milking of the cows.

Curtis said showing the cows is still his favorite, but milking is his second favorite, even though it takes longer.

Don't be misled, showing animals takes lots of hard work. Contestants don't just pick a cow out of the herd and walk off to a show. They have to work with the animals almost every day so that a rapport between animal and presenter exists.

They also have to know the parts of the animal, characteristics and information about the breed, how to show off their animal's best qualities, and how to dress and act in the show ring.

Curtis probably weighs all of 80 pounds, if that. The full grown cows he's been showing generally weigh in the neighborhood of 1,300 pounds. You have to have respect for that difference, so he has had to work with Gem a lot and build up his strength. But, he'll tell you it hurts to get stepped on, especially if you're only wearing rubber boots.

Karen explained that at parent-teacher conferences last year, Curtis' teacher said she got a kick out of a narrative he wrote about almost being kicked by a cow.

What does Curtis want to be when he grows up? At 9, he said there are lots of things he'd like to do, but "I can't do them all at the same time."
