Construction season picks up



Work continues on two projects near the intersection of Greenwood Street and Oakland Park Road in Thief River Falls. A force main is being bored at that location, and manholes are being installed for storm sewer. The former project, which is being undertaken by the City of Thief River Falls, involves the replacement of the existing 20-inch force main installed in 1973. The force main will be replaced from

the lift station along Greenwood Street to the wastewater treatment ponds. The project is about two-thirds complete. The latter project is part of the Westside Flood Damage Reduction Project organized by the Red Lake Watershed District. The WFD RP will divert water outside the urban area to provide 100-year flood protection within the city and 10-year flood protection to rural areas along the project.

Systemic barriers exist in health care, too

During a Minnesota Department of Health media briefing on COVID-19 on Monday, June 1, Commissioner Jan Malcolm talked about some of the glaring racial disparities that exist in the COVID-19 statistics.

Malcolm said it was important to put this day's COVID-19 statistics in context with the events (civil unrest) of last week in Minnesota and across the nation.

Malcolm noted that the Minnesota Department of Health has tried to document and call attention to health disparities "literally for decades." As long as 20 years ago, the Minnesota Department of Health linked socioeconomic conditions with health outcomes. Six years ago, the Department of Health released a report that called out the structural barriers that systemically prevent some people from reaching their highest potential for good health. That report showed that the structural barriers and racism contributing to persistent and glaring

health disparities were some of the worst in the nation for people of color. Since that time, she said, they have worked with various partners and have made some progress, but it has been frustratingly little progress.

Malcolm noted that African-Americans make up 6.6 percent of the population in Minnesota, but over 22 percent of COVID-19 cases, and 20 percent of hospitalizations. The Hispanic population makes up 5.5 percent of the population in Minnesota, but 20 percent of COVID cases and 13 percent of hospitalizations.

Civil Unrest and spread of COVID-19
Malcolm said the Department of Health is concerned all of Minnesota might face additional risks as a result of large gatherings from civil unrest this past weekend. They do expect a spike in cases, although the fact that the event took place outside could have lessened the risk. On the other hand, loud talking and singing exacerbate spread. Key transmission factors are still considered to be proximity and length of time.

Officials don't believe contact tracing for those who participated in the protests will be possible. When contacted, they'd like to know if

Candidates file for county/state positions

Interest grows in who's running for office

Candidates have filed for area county and state offices. The filing period ended Tuesday, June 2.

Filing periods for city council and school district posts are Tuesday, July 28 until Tuesday, Aug. 11 at 5 p.m.

Per the Minnesota Secretary of State's website as of early Wednesday afternoon,

the following candidates filed for county and state office:

Kittson County

Three county commissioner seats will be on the ballot in Kittson County. Three candidates have filed for District 1, including Brian Anderson, Nathan A. Kraulik and incumbent Corey Wikstrom. Incumbents Theresia Gillie (District 2) and Leon Olson (District 4) face no opposition.

Three soil and water supervisor positions will also be on the ballot. C.J. Peterson filed for District 1 while Carey Mortenson filed for District 2. No one filed for

District 5.

Marshall County

Three county commissioner positions will be on the ballot in Marshall County. Incumbents Rolland Miller (District 2) and Sharon Bring (District 4) face no opposition. Ben Kleinwachter and Larry P. Nybladh are vying for the District 3 seat currently held by Kenneth Borowicz.

Brent Miller (District 1) and Carl Green (District 2) have filed for the two soil and water supervisor positions on the ballot.

Pennington County

Three county commissioner positions will be on the ballot in Pennington

County. Incumbent Don Jensen and Seth Nelson have filed for District 1. Julie Bolduc, Don Sollom and Dave Sorenson have filed for the District 2 seat currently held by Cody Hempel. Grant Asp and incumbent Bruce Lawrence have filed for the District 5 seat.

ADawn Nelson (District 1), Linda Hanson (District 4) and Gregory Hilgeman (District 5) have filed for the soil and water supervisor positions on the ballot.

Polk County

Three county commissioner seats will be on the ballot in Polk County. Incumbent Gerald Jacobson

and Travis E. Johnson have filed for the District 1 position. Incumbent Gary Willhite faces no opposition in District 3 while two candidates have filed for District 5. Those candidates are Tim Finseth and Mark Holy, who are vying for the seat currently held by Don Diedrich.

Six soil and water supervisor positions will also be on the ballot. Three will be on the ballot for East Polk. No one has filed for District 3. Scott Balstad (District 4) and Lawrence P. Vettleson (District 5) have filed for the other two positions for East

ACE Hardware in TRF celebrates 75th

Third generation takes over ownership

Almost unnoticed among all the COVID-19 news, ACE Hardware store in downtown Thief River Falls celebrated its 75th anniversary. Now under the ownership of a third generation, ACE Hardware continues to be an invaluable asset to the region.

The ACE Hardware store in Thief River Falls opened by a group of independent business owners in 1945 as ACE Store 114. The Kalinoski family has owned and operated the store since 1961.

Nationally, ACE Stores was founded in 1924. Its name changed to "Ace Hardware Corporation" in 1931. It grew dramatically following World War II, more than tripling its sales between the late 1940s and 1959. Ace Hardware now has over 5,000 stores around the

world with the majority of those stores independently owned and operated by local entrepreneurs.

Vic Kalinoski started working in hardware at the age of 19. In his biography, Kalinoski wrote that after high school in 1938, he stayed on the farm with his folks west of Greenbush until Feb. 14, 1939, when he was given a chance by Bill Ekstrand, who was a son-in-law of the Hildahls, who owned the Hildahl Hardware store, to work at the store. The Hildahls then opened another hardware store in Roseau and that's how Vic and Bill Ekstrand got a start.

In March of 1942, Uncle Sam called and a busload from Roseau County, which included Kalinoski, went to Fort Snelling to join the Army. Kalinoski ended up as a company clerk. He said his typing skills and store experience got him the job. While in the Army, Kalinoski served in New Zealand, Australia, India, and Iran. He got home in the spring of 1945, and he was home when the ACE Hardware store in Thief River Falls

had its grand opening on April 13. After some detours, he returned home at the end of November and ACE Hardware in Greenbush was waiting for him. He soon became manager and part

owner as Bill Ekstrand was in Thief River Falls. Kalinoski managed the store in Greenbush for 13 years before moving to the store in Roseau for two years. He next managed the store in

Thief River Falls for four years. After that he became the manager of the ACE store in Waukegan, Ill. in 1959. Two years later, in

VIP receives Women's Foundation grant

Violence Intervention Project has received a \$7,500 grant from the Women's Foundation of Minnesota.

The grant will be used to provide short-term financial assistance and housing for victim-survivors of sexual and domestic violence who have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, and to provide hazard pay for advocates working on the frontlines with clients. VIP works to end violence and the acceptance of all forms of violence in the counties of Kittson, Marshall, Pennington, Red Lake and Roseau.

The grant was among the second round of grants from the Women's Foundation of Minnesota. Seventeen organizations received grants through the WFMN's COVID-19 Women and Girls

Response Fund, for a total of \$127,500 in general operating grants. In the first two rounds of grantmaking through this fund, WFMN has awarded more than \$360,000 to 44 organizations across the state to address the needs of women and girls experiencing gender-based violence, older women, and short-term financial support for everyday needs, including childcare, eldercare, food, housing, transportation, health, and wellness.

In total, the COVID-19 Women and Girls Response Fund will issue a half-million dollars in emergency grants of up to \$10,000 to organizations serving women and girls affected by the crisis.

Council votes to pay Kraulik

Karlstad - Karlstad City Council members voted Monday, June 1 to pay Kraulik Construction the remaining \$24,000, plus interest, for lagoon repair. The stipulations are that Kraulik provide a written statement of its perspective on the miscommunication issue and have the understanding that if the firm does future work for the city, the firm will need to meet with City Council to fully explain costs.

Mayor Dale Nelson and other council members expressed frustration that Kraulik hadn't made it

clear that the cost of the project would be so much higher than the approved \$18,000 cost because of additional work that the firm completed.

Four council members voted yes to paying Kraulik with Mike Wade abstaining from the vote.

City staff will also be asked to provide a written statement of the miscommunication issue from their perspective to have on the record. - *North Star News of Karlstad, June 4, 2020, by Linda Andersen*

City closes pool for summer

Greenbush - No one will be making splashes at the Greenbush Pool, and it will remain empty after the Greenbush City Council closed it for the summer, citing the difficulty in abiding by the state's COVID-19 guidelines as a major reason. It also mentioned financial factors, the unknowns surrounding the opening timeline, and upcoming pool renovation as other reasons.

City Attorney Michelle Moren recommended that if the city opened the pool, it would have to hire an adult to enforce COVID-19 guidelines. - *The Tribune of Greenbush, June 3, 2020, by Ryan Bergeron*

Rosettes

2 eggs

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup flour

1 teaspoon sugar

1 cup milk

Beat eggs, sugar and salt slightly, add milk and flour.

Beat until smooth. Bake with a rosette iron. Heat iron form well in boiling oil

or fat and dip into batter, being careful not to let batter run over the form. Dip the iron with batter sticking to it into the hot fat until nicely browned. This makes 40 rosettes. Omit the sugar in batter if used for anything but cake. When serving, sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Vehicle lands on roof after accident in TRF

Two people suffered unknown injuries Monday night after a two-vehicle accident led one vehicle to come to rest on its roof in Thief River Falls.

Brittney Jo Johnson of Warren and Cindy L. Sanden of Thief River Falls were the drivers involved in the accident, according to the Thief River Falls Police

Department. It was unknown if they were transported to Sanford Medical Center in Thief River Falls.

At the time of the accident, Johnson was driving a 2010 Dodge Charger northbound on Knight Avenue. According to the police report, her car then collided with Sanden's 2015 Ford Edge. Sanden, who was traveling eastbound on 11th Street, was halfway through the uncontrolled intersection at the time. The Thief River Falls Fire Department noted that the impact of the crash caused Sanden's vehicle to come to rest on its roof. Police cited Johnson for failure to yield. Police were dispatched to the scene at 6:58 p.m. Monday.

Regrets abound in era of social media

I've said it before and I guess it bears repeating - be careful of what you post on social media sites. It just may come back to haunt you.

To be fair, most of my previous editorials urging individuals to be careful of what they post on social media sites were directed at young people. But young people aren't the only ones who make mistakes, adults do stupid things too. If you, for example, suggest someone could drive a car through protestors, or suggest that someone might fire real bullets into the crowd, it's quite possible that an employer or taxpayer could be watching, and there could be consequences. That was the point made to young people in previous editorials - what you post online is forever and could get spread far and wide and impact you in ways you can't even imagine today.

Yes, there's such a thing as freedom of speech, but there is a limit. An employer may decide they don't want to be connected to someone who suggests shooting protestors is a good thing. Taxpayers may be highly offended by an elected official who be-

lieves it may be appropriate to drive a vehicle through a crowd of protestors. Even if a joke, that joke could fall flat with your audience.

We live in an era of technology. More and more employers are using that technology to check on and assess current and future employees based on their social media profiles. Why, and what are they looking for? They want to know if you're a fit with the company, whether you plan to stay in your current job, whether and how you question authority, your values and whether you're passionate, caring and committed, and what kind of risk you pose to their reputation

Our jobs and reputations are among the most important things in our lives and should be treated as such. Remember, what you post online can and will be used against you in the court of public opinion and by your employer.

I like the advice shared by military.com: "Instead of resisting social media, remember to post content which is true, consistent with your values, collaborative and interesting. Then, it is likely you won't make the mistakes outlined above."

Four officers charged in Floyd's death

Minnesota Attorney General Keith Ellison announced on June 3 that he has filed a charge of second-degree murder against former Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin. The new second-degree murder charge joins the previously-filed charges of third degree murder and second degree manslaughter.

Ellison also announced that he and Hennepin County Attorney Mike Freeman have filed charges of aiding and abetting second-degree murder and second-degree manslaughter against former Minneapolis officers J.A. Kueng, Thomas Lane, and Tou Thao. Arrest warrants have been issued for Kueng, Lane, and Thao.

All the complaints charge that the four officers caused Floyd's death while using unlawful and excessive force in arresting Floyd.

The complaints allege that on the evening of May 25, the officers arrested Floyd at 38th Street and Chicago Avenue in Minneapolis. In detaining Floyd, Chauvin used an unauthorized restraint technique in which he pressed his knee into Floyd's neck to restrict Floyd's movement while Floyd was handcuffed and laying on the pavement. Lane and Kueng held Floyd by the legs and hips to further restrict movement. Thao stood guard to prevent members of the public, who gathered nearby to witness the police action, from intervening to aid Floyd. While the officers restrained him nearly motionless on the ground, Floyd repeatedly told the officer he could not breathe and also said that he was about to die.

Last week, Chauvin was charged with third degree murder but now faces an additional charge of second degree murder.

Also on June 3, Gov. Tim Walz released the following statement following :

"I laid flowers at George Floyd's memorial this morn-

ing. What will our young people learn about this moment? Will his death be just another blip in a textbook? Or will it go down in history as when our country turned toward justice and change?"

"It's on each of us to determine that answer."

"The charges announced by Attorney General Keith Ellison are a meaningful step toward justice for George Floyd. But we must also recognize that the anguish driving protests around the world is about more than one tragic incident."

"George Floyd's death is the symptom of a disease. We will not wake up one day and have the disease of systemic racism cured for us. This is on each of us to solve together, and we have hard work ahead."

"We owe that much to George Floyd, and we owe that much to each other."

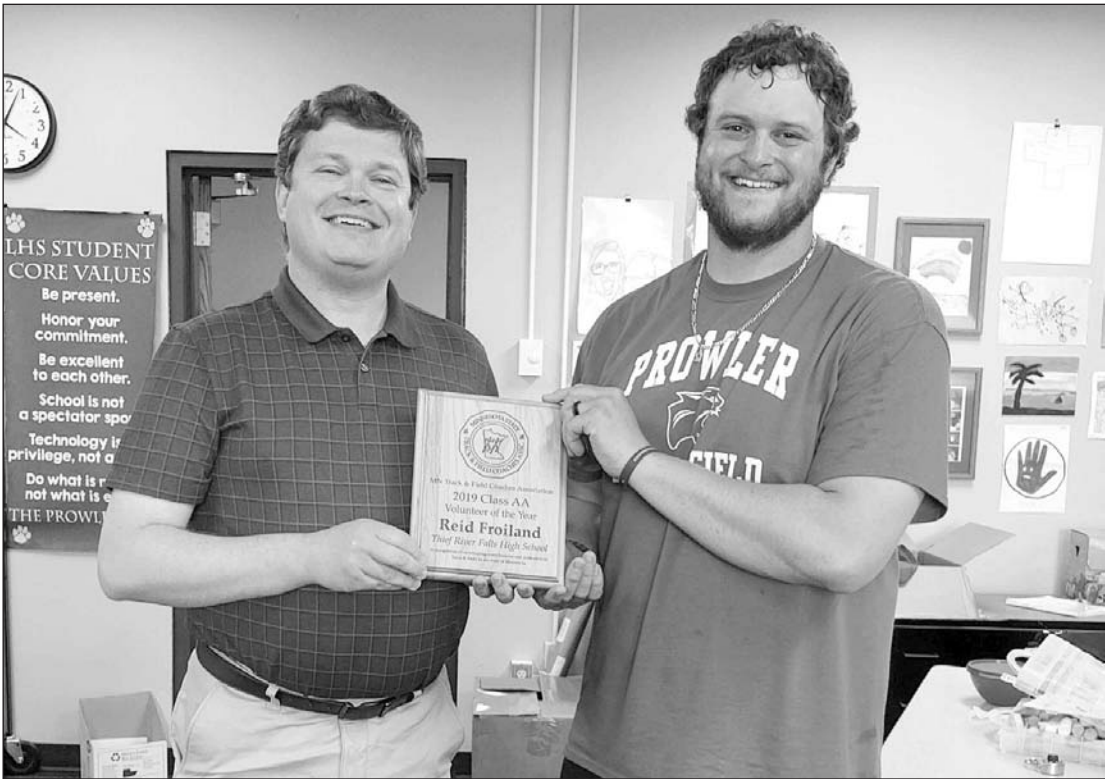

Results of deer goal setting announced

Northwestern and western Minnesota included in updates

The Department of Natural Resources has set new deer population goals that reflect Minnesotans' diverse perspectives about deer.

"We really appreciate the perspectives brought to the table," said Barbara Keller, DNR's big game program manager. "We took what we heard seriously as we set goals."

The DNR sets deer population goals – how much of an increase or decrease is desired in a deer population in a particular deer permit area – as part of managing the state's wild deer herd.

The DNR set goals for 36 of the state's 130 deer permit areas, generally those located in northwestern and western Minnesota. This was the first area of focus, and the DNR will be covering other areas in future years. The goals set in 2020 provide

the framework for annual decisions on deer season regulations and are intended to be in effect for the next 10 years, with a midpoint review at five years.

The DNR gathered information and feedback from over 700 online survey respondents, online comments, and conversations with area wildlife managers. The DNR also used a new workshop format to facilitate eight small group discussions to both scope issues and create recommendations. These workshops replaced citizen advisory committees and public meetings that were used during deer goal setting in 2015.

Participants reviewed information related to deer populations, harvest trends, habitat, browsing impacts and public health and safety. They also provided feedback on locally important deer management factors. People can find key issues that influenced the goal changes detailed by permit area online.

In the first year of the re-

newed goal-setting process, the DNR focused on areas in the northwestern and western parts of the state. In general, the goals are to increase deer populations in the north, stabilize populations in the northwest and west, and slightly decrease populations in the central portions of the areas addressed this year.

"We are really happy with the participation and conversations we had," Keller said. "We look forward to hearing from others in coming years."

About deer population goals

The DNR updates deer population goals in 14 regional goal-setting blocks comprising multiple deer permit areas. The goal-setting process will take four years to complete statewide, with several geographic blocks addressed each year. Next year's process will include southwestern Minnesota and parts of northeastern Minnesota. The DNR lists complete details on the goal-setting webpage.

This year, the walk/run will be held in honor of An-

The team has been working on a plan to minimize congestion and contact for those who will be actively walking and running. This year's event will include a 5K and one-mile walk/run. The 10K walk/run will not be held as part of the event this year. The one-mile will also use the roads to help spread participants out.

Registration forms have been printed and will be distributed to local businesses. Anyone who would like to be mailed a form should text 218-469-3053 and leave a request and mailing address.

Participants can also register online at <https://www.temptickets.com/RoseauALS2020>.

The 5K will again be timed by Gopher State Events Timing again.

The early registration deadline is July 1 to be guaranteed an event T-shirt. Everyone is encouraged to participate in early registra-

tion to eliminate long registration lines. Organizers are still reviewing if they will allow registration the day of the event.

Prizes will be awarded for the top individuals that raise the most funds. Door prizes will be available and the color run will be part of the event.

Three soil and water supervisor positions will be on the ballot for West Polk. The candidates include Derek Peterson (District 2), Christian C. Pester (District 4) and Chris Cournia (District 5).

Red Lake County

Two county commissioner positions will be on the ballot in Red Lake County. Incumbent Ron Weiss faces no opposition in District 2. Eddie Amberson and Tony Gerardy have filed for the District 5 seat currently held by Charles Simpson.

Three soil and water supervisor positions will also be on the ballot. Candidates are Linda Mickelson (District 3), Mark A. LaCrosse (District 4) and Nathan Whalen (District 5).

Roseau County

Two county commissioner

seats will be on the ballot in Roseau County. Incumbent Jack Swanson faces no opposition in District 2. Brett Creger and incumbent Russell Walker have filed for the District 4 position.

Three soil and water supervisor positions will also be on the ballot. Landon Olson filed for the District 5 position while no one filed for either of the other two seats – Districts 1 and 2 – on the ballot.

State seats

The position of District 1 state senator will be on the ballot. Incumbent Mark Johnson (R) and Reed Perkins (DFL) have filed for the position.

State representative seats for Districts 1A and 1B will also be on the ballot. Candidates for the District 1A seat include Republicans John Burkell, David Lion and Brian Meehan, and

Gruenhagen and incumbent Collin Peterson, all of the DFL Party; Slater Johnson of the Legal Marijuana Now Party; Rae Hart Anderson and Kevin “NeSe” Shores, both of the Grassroots – Legalize Cannabis Party; and Noel Collis, Michelle Fischbach, Dave Hughes, William Louwagie and Javesun Israel Sherman, all of the Republican Party.

Allow bars and restaurants to open

The Minnesota Licensed Beverage Association, which represents Minnesota’s small, family-owned liquor retailers, both on-sale (of bars and restaurants) and off-sale, is calling for Minnesota bars and restaurants to be allowed to open.

“Minnesota bars and restaurants are ready to be safely opened as soon as possible for indoor dining. We have preparedness plans, have significant experience working with strong safety regulations, and will protect

our customers, staff, and vendors.

“Minnesota’s hospitality industry has met every request from the governor’s office and the Department of Employment and Economic Development, offering guidance on safety measures and an opening “play book” – and yet, have still have not received a date for re-opening. Other states in the Midwest – including Michigan, Ohio and Indiana – are all re-opening or have opened their indoor dining at a min-

imum 50% capacity.”

The organization also stated that patio-only service is not acceptable because many do not have a patio or time to wait for municipalities to change their codes. Because of its expense, it also doesn’t make economic sense.

“Business health is part of public health, and bars and restaurants CAN safely open for indoor service and follow the precautions and structure being put in place.”

March of 1961, Vic and his wife, Vi, purchased the ACE store in Thief River Falls. That’s also the time his son, Ron, began working at the store.

Ron said his hardware career began in the second grade.

“My early job duties included counting and delivering circulars, sweeping floors, emptying trash cans, and going to school. I worked part-time throughout my school years, later taking some time off to see what life was like outside my father’s business.” In 1975, at the age of 21, Ron re-entered the family business full-time and never stopped working. In January of 1982, at the age of 28, he purchased the business, allowing his mother and father to retire.

ACE in Thief River Falls has always been a family-run business. Nick’s mom has done the books for years and still does. Ron’s brother, Tom, still runs ACE Rental across the street.

When Ron took over the business from his parents, the next generation was already in training. Like his father, Nick Kalinoski also started working at the store in second grade. Nick said his teacher would walk him across the street, and he would work in the store from 3:15 to 5 p.m. every day performing many of the same duties his dad did when he started. On Feb. 1, 2019, Nick became the next family member to take over ownership of ACE Hardware in Thief River Falls.

Nick said he’d always thought he would like to take over the store some day, but there’s a certain amount of pressure that comes with doing so.

Second-generation businesses have a 60 percent of failure, while third-generation businesses fail at a rate of 90 percent. Some of the reasons they fail is family dysfunction, different visions, lack of planning, a lack of family succession planning and a lack of financial knowledge.

Nick said he’s always had a good relationship with his dad. He said they may have different opinions on things, but they always got along. They’ve also focused on taking care of customers and planning for the future.

Since taking over the store at the age of 26, Nick had implemented a number of changes. “If you don’t keep up with the changing times, you fall behind,” said Nick.

Those changes aren’t too dramatic. For instance, he installed a new computer system that tracks sales and inventory, which isn’t too revolutionary. He also instituted online purchases and pick-ups at the store, which is how many brick and mortar businesses are surviving today. He has also implemented the ACE Customer Reward Program, and started a little bit of delivery.

All these things help the store stay competitive. He acknowledges, however, that the one thing they’ve been doing for years is key - emphasizing customer relations. It’s absolutely

essential.

Nick said for years people have relied on ACE to help solve their problems, and he wants to make sure they continue to have confidence that they can solve those problems. He said that comes with making sure staff can communicate their product knowledge and build trust and confidence in customers.

Regarding the purchase of the store and his new duties, Nick said it’s a lot to take in. He admits he spends more time behind the scenes than he anticipated.

Nick has also always loved living in Thief River Falls. He said he never imagined ever living somewhere else. Many of his friends moved away as soon as they graduated, but he’s seeing more and more of them returning to the community. Thief River Falls is a great place to live, he said.

Nick also said he wouldn’t mind opening another store in the future. He added that he’s very thankful to all the loyal customers.

MPCA calls for contested case hearing for Line 3

On Feb. 26, 2020, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) issued the draft 401 Water Quality Certificate permit for the Line 3 Replacement Project. Following a public comment period, the MPCA announced June 3 that it will conduct a contested case hearing regarding the 401 permit.

On Wednesday, June 3, Enbridge issued the following statement:

“The timeline for the contested case hearing will be established after an Administrative Law Judge is assigned to the case. While the MPCA previously stated its intention to meet the US Army Corps of Engineers’ Aug. 15, 2020, deadline, that date has been extended to Nov. 14, 2020, which is within the one-year anniversary of our application, as required by statute.

“Enbridge Inc. (NYSE: ENB) (TSX: ENB) will continue to work with other permitting agencies towards the timely issuance of the remaining permits in order to allow for the start of construction before year end 2020. We now expect the majority of the remaining US\$1.5 billion of capital spending to occur in 2021, with spending related to early construction preparation in 2020. The company will continue to advance pre-construction activities, to ensure an efficient schedule is maintained.

“While the contested case has caused a delay to the permitting process, we believe this additional step will strengthen the MPCA’s decision record,” said Vern Yu, president of Liquids Pipelines. “We have planned for various permitting scenarios with the objective of accelerating and completing construction of this important safety and maintenance driven project within six to nine months after we receive final permits.”

“Enbridge’s Line 3 Replacement Project is the most studied pipeline in Minnesota’s history. It has already undergone an extensive contested case hearing process lasting nearly five years as part of the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission’s review and approval of the project. There have been numerous public comment opportunities both written and in-person, including 70 public meetings. The Project’s Environmental Impact Statement, Certificate of Need and Route Permit were re-approved by the Commission on Feb. 4, 2020. In addition, Enbridge has agreed to numerous permit conditions, as a result of stakeholder input during the process, and we have committed to spend US\$100 million on Tribal business and employment.

“This project is immediately poised to provide significant economic benefits

for counties, small businesses, Native American communities, and union members. Line 3 is a shovel ready US\$2.9 billion private investment that will bring

4,200 family-sustaining construction jobs, millions of dollars in local spending and tax revenues at a time when northern Minnesota needs it most.”

Honor the Earth issues statement on MPCA decision

Winona LaDuke, co-founder and executive director of Honor the Earth, issued the following statement regarding MPCA’s decision to hold a contested case hearing for the Line 3 replacement project:

“Honor the Earth applauds the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency’s (MPCA) decision to hold a contested case hearing for the Line 3 Replacement Project, but is dismayed that the MPCA has formally decided to not analyze oil spill impacts and Enbridge’s plans to respond to an oil spill, despite the fact that it is the only Minnesota agency that has a duty under law to protect Minnesota from oil spill impacts. Honor the Earth requested

that the MPCA consider the toxic impacts of an oil spill on wild rice because wild rice is particularly sensitive to the toxic sulfate and sulfite compounds in heavy Canadian crude oil. Honor the Earth also requested that MPCA consider the impact of an oil spill on Lake Superior. The MPCA said that because oil spills happen during operation of pipelines, that it can ignore the potential water quality impacts of oil spills. MPCA has now left review of Enbridge’s oil spill response plans in the hands of the Trump Administration. We are evaluating our rights to judicial appeal of the MPCA’s abdication of its legal duty to protect Minnesota from oil spills.”

Jobs for Minnesota issue statement on MPCA decision

On June 3, Jobs for Minnesotans released the following statement following the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency’s decision to hold contested case hearings for the Line 3 Replacement Project 401 certification:

“We are dismayed by today’s MPCA decision to conduct a contested case process for the Line 3 Replacement Project 401 certification. This decision delays the permitting process for a project that will protect the environment, which is progressively more at risk as this review process continues. We recognize that the MPCA made this decision given the recent Court of Appeals ruling on PolyMet, a ruling that is up for review

in the Minnesota Supreme Court.

“Line 3 is the most thoroughly reviewed project in Minnesota’s history. Communities across Minnesota are waiting with urgency to put thousands of skilled tradespeople to work and for the \$2.6 billion investment in the state’s energy infrastructure. This privately funded project will provide a significant economic stimulus for Greater Minnesota that is needed now more than ever.

“We encourage our allies in business, labor and communities who believe this project is right for Minnesota to remain engaged and resilient, and we ask that the MPCA and the Office of Administrative Hearings be efficient and keep the process laser focused on the narrow issues addressed in today’s agency decision.”

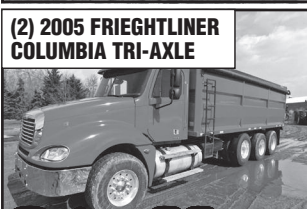

COVID-19 update: Systemic barriers exist in health care/Continued

(Continued from Page 1) individuals participated in the protests. They are also encouraging protestors to get tested. The virus can spread quickly in large groups of people who are together for a longer period of time while shouting or singing. Individuals who feel sick are encouraged to get tested right away. Even if they don't feel sick, they should get tested five to seven days after the protest. Additionally, even if they get a negative result and they feel they were exposed to someone who tested positive, they can get tested again. The optimal source for testing would be through an individual's primary care provider. If unsure where to get a test, Malcolm encouraged people to visit the Minnesota Department of Health's COVID Response website.

In response to a question from a reporter on Wednesday, Malcolm said they did

talk about whether it would be successful or useful to test people where they were gathering to protest but didn't feel it would have done a lot of good as, for example, there wasn't assigned seating.

The incubation period for COVID-19 is from two to 14 days, but frequently, people start to get symptomatic between five and seven days. The impact of this past week's activities, and possible COVID-19 spread, probably won't be known for up to three weeks.

Department of Health officials explained the reason that it could be up to three weeks to see the impact is because the incubation period is from two to 14 days, and then there's additional time for people who are symptomatic to go in and get tested, and for the results of those tests to be returned.

Monday, Dr. Ruth Lynfield, state epidemiologist, urged individuals who par-

ticipated in the protests to stay away from individuals with underlying health conditions.

Infection rates

As of June 1, there were 6.2 million cases globally, and 372,000 deaths. In the United States, there were 1.8 million cases and 104,000 deaths.

In Minnesota, there were a cumulative 25,208 positive cases, and 1,050 deaths. Key figures in the data are active cases: 5,767 active cases (total positive cases minus patients no longer needing isolation); and, cases requiring hospitalization that day: 549, 253 of which requiring intensive care. (These occupancy numbers may not be entirely COVID-19 related.)

On June 3, there were 6.4 million cases globally, and 381,000 deaths. In the U.S., there were 1.8 million cases, and 106,000 deaths.

In Minnesota, there were a cumulative 25,870 cases, and 1,086 deaths, 4,701 ac-

tive cases, 537 hospitalized as of that day, and 254 of those in ICU.

Malcolm said on Wednesday that there has been a slow but steady decline in hospitalizations since last Wednesday, while individuals requiring hospitalization remaining stable.

Some hospitals in the Twin Cities have expanded into surge beds, although Malcolm said the degree of data sharing among health systems is unprecedented and has become an essential tool to adjusting to any capacity as the infection rate and state goes forward.

In addition, it should be noted that the health care system is still within the range of current capacity. "Overall," said Malcolm, "we're still above that threshold of at least 5% available capacity."

They also noted that this is not an unprecedented demand right now. For example, during regular flu

season, ICU capacity can be at 95%.

Malcolm and Kris Ehresmann, infectious disease division director, were noting some fluctuations in the numbers. Deaths, for example, have fluctuated significantly from day to day recently. Malcolm also noted that the case doubling rate is now just at over 20 days, which shows a flattening of the curve.

Officials noted on Wednesday that hospital admissions also continue to decline. These are all positive

or favorable trends, but officials are not ready to describe it as Minnesota's peak or even a plateau.

Ehresmann said she favors the imagery of waves when talking about the rate of positive cases rather than a peak.

There may be many more waves to come.

Wednesday, officials said they are grateful a lot of indicators are not going up, but there have been a lot of changes in the past week that may mean another wave is coming.
