Northland nursing earns top ranking

Northland Community and Technical College's on-line practical nursing program has earned a #4 ranking by EduMed. EduMed data scientists utilized data from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) from more than 7,700 accredited colleges across the U.S. and created a proprietary algorithm to rank each postsecondary institution and its online programs using five primary factors: cost, online program availability, academic counseling, career placement, and financial aid availability.

Northland has been leading the way in online program delivery and has offered an online Practical Nursing cohort for approximately 25 years. The program is presented in a hybrid format over three semesters. General education course requirements are completed in one semester with nursing courses completed in two. All general education courses and theory practical nursing courses are completed entirely online. Lab and clinical hours are completed by students on the East Grand Forks

Signs COVID-19 is getting on nerves

Officer resigns, seeks to rescind resignation and then decides to resign after all

COVID-19 continues to impact various decisions made by the City of Thief River Falls and its employees. The Public Safety/Liquor Committee heard those matters at a marathon meeting lasting nearly three-and-a-half hours Monday, July 13.

"There's a lot of underlying stress being on the front-line of this thing," said Steve Olson, manager of the city-

owned Falls Liquor.

COVID-19 fatigue is setting in for liquor store employees. Olson said he had to remind one employee about sanitizing hands after handling a rug and remind at least two employees about not using tills near one another when the store wasn't busy. He noted COVID-19 is wearing on people even when they don't realize it. Olson added employees have heard from customers that bars have been wall to wall with people in the area.

Council member Rachel Prudhomme, who sits on the committee, said she and council member Jason Aarestad had heard concerns from someone about a recent concert. Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2793 has held at least two concerts re-

cently in its parking lot. The individual raised concerns about the number of people attending the concerts. Prudhomme said she believed it may have been hard to keep track of the number of people moving back and forth between the bar and the parking lot.

Prudhomme indicated that VFW Commander Erik Beitel was out of town during one of the concerts when there was an apparent issue. Beitel is employed as Pennington County's emergency management director and has been on the frontlines of the county's response to COVID-19.

In terms of other private bars, Prudhomme said she doesn't think police officers may walk into a bar unless their presence is justified.

She said the city has to trust bar owners when it comes to following social distancing guidelines.

Like bars, Falls Liquor remains open to the public – albeit for fewer hours than it has been open in the past. Located kitty-corner to Falls Liquor, City Hall remains closed to the public. Aarestad, who chairs the committee, voiced his disappointment and said it didn't seem right that Falls Liquor was open while City Hall was closed.

The matter was discussed more thoroughly later in the meeting. City Administrator Angie Philipp said the city is in the process of obtaining and installing glass at City Hall to allow for social distancing.

Aarestad, who chairs the

committee, replied that the city doesn't need special glass in City Hall as part of its COVID-19 precautions.

Philipp responded that the city is placing glass permanently in specific areas where it is needed.

Officer Ryan Bassett appeared before the committee via Webex. He asked to rescind his resignation. Bassett had tendered his resignation in June with an effective date of Sunday, July 26. The full council approved filling the position at its meeting six days before the committee meeting. The committee referred the matter on to the full council, which would have been the final authority on Bassett's appeal. Even if the council

Public health director:

Prevention is key to this fight

It's the story that never seems to end – COVID-19. Inter-County Nursing Service Director Kayla Jore repeated the message she has been sharing since the United States began fighting the illness.

"The more we can prevent the spread, the better," Jore said at the Pennington County Board meeting Tuesday, July 14.

Jore noted that COVID-19 fatigue is setting in. However, she reminded people to wash their hands, social distance and wear masks.

"It's highly recommended when you're going out in public that you wear those masks," said Jore, who noted it helps stop the COVID-19 germs from being spread to others.

Jore admitted that wearing a face mask can be uncomfortable. However, she said, "Masking is very important."

At the time of the County Board meeting, Pennington County had 54 cases of COVID-19. Two were active cases. (It grew to 55 cases the following day.) Jore said the county was "seeing another case situation" in long-term care. She noted the

unidentified long-term care facility had been doing all the right things, but this was bound to happen. The facility is working closely with the Minnesota Department of Health and the Health Care Coalition.

MDH lists COVID-19 cases in congregate care facilities on its website. That list is updated each Friday, and facilities are removed from that list if they haven't reported a new exposure for a minimum of 28 days. Exposures include those who either visited, worked or lived at a facility while they were contagious.

A variety of age levels

have been affected by COVID-19 in Pennington County, and Inter-County Nursing Service does case investigation and contact tracing for those cases. The cases range from kids ages 10-19 to adults 70 and over. At this point in time, the majority of the affected individuals in Pennington County – 37 – were in their 20s and 30s.

Emergency Management Director Erik Beitel noted the 54 cases amount to less than 1% of the county's population. He noted that Beltrami and Roseau counties

Sheriff's office receives increased reports of scams

The Polk County Sheriff's Office has recently received an increased number of scam reports.

These scams are using scare tactics by claiming the person's ID and Social Security number are tied into money laundering or other serious crimes out of state. The victim is then instructed to either purchase a large amount of gift cards to stay out of trouble or told to send

all of their cash to the scammer for "safe keeping," so the money doesn't get seized as part of the money laundering investigation.

If anyone receives a call similar to the one described above or any other call they feel is a scam, they are urged to not divulge any personal information, hang up and contact their local law enforcement agency.

TRF man injured after motorcycle and SUV collide

A Thief River Falls man was injured after his motorcycle and a sport utility vehicle collided late Sunday afternoon in Thief River Falls.

Scott J. Hickerson of Thief River Falls was transported to Sanford Medical Center in Thief River Falls, according to the Thief River Falls Police Department. Another source indicated that Hickerson was later airlifted to a hospital in Fargo, N.D.

No injuries were reported to the other driver, James

Dale Hjelle of Newfolden.

At the time of the accident, Hjelle was driving a 2010 Chevy Equinox southbound on Highway 59. According to the report, he turned east in front of Hickerson's northbound motorcycle in the 1500 block of Hwy. 59 S. Hickerson was driving a 2010 Harley-Davidson motorcycle at the time. Hjelle then allegedly left the scene.

Hjelle has been cited for failure to stop for a collision and failure to yield the right of way to oncoming traffic.

Hallock City Council approves TIF district

Hallock - The Hallock City Council approved a plan establishing a residential tax increment financing, or TIF, district at its meeting Monday, July 6.

The TIF district encompasses more than 100 parcels in the residential addition on the south edge of the city as well as parcels scattered throughout the city, including the former elementary school lot.

The city has been considering implementing a TIF district for some time. TIF districts are designed to help promote housing development throughout cities.





COVID-19 news:

Increases raise red flags

The number of positive cases in Minnesota increased by 578 cases from Tuesday on a testing volume of about 12,500. The continued growth in positive cases is a growing concern. The number of individuals hospitalized with COVID-19 increased by 18 to a total of 254, and the number of individuals requiring intensive care dropped by one to 106.

Other important metrics, including the positivity rate and median age, also showed changes. The median age of individuals infected by COVID-19 dropped to 37.5; and, the rate of positivity over a seven day period increased from 4.7 percent to 4.8 percent.

Officials said Wednesday, that the recent surge in positive cases across the country is affecting supply chains. In Minnesota, officials said that they do track the amount of personal protective equipment quite closely. They have quite a supply on hand, but supply chain issues are beginning to re-emerge.

The commissioner of health, Jan Malcolm, said they aren't assuming they have enough. "We have a good supply, but we're closely watching what's happening with global supply chains."

As noted over the past several weeks, the number of people in Minnesota dying from COVID-19 complications has remained stable. On Tuesday, eight more deaths were recorded

Kris Ehresmann, infectious diseases director for the Minnesota Department of Health, said any one indicator is valuable, but a single indicator is not enough to understand the full picture.

Any death is serious, but when the number of deaths remain stable or decline,

there's a temptation to think it's manageable, but Ehresmann pointed out there can be long-term health consequences from COVID-19.

Ehresmann was asked about the specific statistics about people dying from COVID-19. Ehresmann said there have not been any deaths among individuals from birth to 19. Of the deaths from COVID-19, .02 percent were in the 20 to 29 age group, .13 percent were in the 30 to 39 age group, .31 percent were in the 40 to 49 age group, 1.36 percent were in the 50 to 59 age group; 5.47 percent were in the 60 to 69 age group; 15.26 percent were in the 70 to 79 age group; 30.82 percent were in the 80 to 89 age group; 44.48 percent in the 90 to 99 age group, and 58 percent in the 100-plus age group.

Ehresmann said it's clear that the fatality rate increases with age, but everyone needs to remember there can be serious long-term health consequences for individuals who are younger, and those individuals can also impact spread among those most at risk.

Stability in the death rate is a result of several factors. Malcolm referred back to previous briefing during which Dr. Hicks said they have learned more about COVID-19 and improved treatment of people with the virus.

State Epidemiologist Dr. Ruth Lynfield also said people need to keep in mind that early on deaths were mostly elderly and people with underlying health issues living in congregate care facilities. Since then, they've worked hard to improve detection and in preventing transmission. She also pointed out that the median age of individuals with COVID-19 has declined significantly, which means it's spreading in a population less likely to experience se-

vere complications. Lynfield also noted there is a lag in deaths. (In some states, the official reporting of a COVID-19 death can lag COVID-19 exposure by up to one month.)

Quarantine for Minnesotans

Because of its increase in positive cases, Minnesota has been put on the New York, New Jersey and Connecticut quarantine list. (The quarantine applies to any person arriving from a state with a positive test rate higher than 10 per 100,000 residents over a seven-day rolling average or a state with a 10% or higher positivity rate over a seven-day rolling average.)

This is a reminder, said Lynfield, that everyone has a role to play.

The virus is here to stay, and "we are still in the pandemic and at a worrying point."

Forty-one states, including Minnesota, said Lynfield, are now seeing an increase in positive cases. "We need to step back and see what we can do to slow the spread of the virus."

Lynfield said this is not a discussion about blame. She said they want to communicate to everyone that each of us has a responsibility and ability to prevent transmission of this virus.

Lynfield said they know there is a lot of conflicting information out there. They also know people are sick and tired of hearing about precautions, but this is not the time to let down our guard.

Every few days, she said, there's more good news about vaccines being developed, but everyone should remember that it will be a long time - months - before an effective vaccine becomes available. Until that time it is up to us to do the things that prevent spread.

Rural Reflections ...

Uncertainty follows court ruling

There have been so many stories lately about events that will create cultural change. This might actually be a story that describes true change to a portion of our culture - or not. I mean, I'm not clairvoyant.

Roundup-ready crops made farmers much more productive. You could plant a crop and then spray the weeds without killing off the crop. It cleaned the field of weeds and saved a lot of time. Somewhere along the way, occasional weeds became resistant to the roundup herbicide, which was a concern. I noticed this a few years ago and wrote a column that farmers may have to begin cultivating row crops instead of spraying them. Dicamba came along a few years ago and my row-crop cultivation prediction was put aside.

Recently, the Environmental Protection Agency and the 9th Federal District

Court have been tugging back and forth on the question of whether Dicamba is something farmers could use. So, I can trot out my row crop idea, again. I honestly hope they get Dicamba figured out and we can forget the row crop cultivators for now. However, mechanically killing weeds with a cultivator is one alternative to herbicides.

I could wonder what a row crop world would look like; however, I am old enough to have seen one. The row-crop world requires more patience, especially the first time you cultivate the crop. The crop is so small that you must be careful to not accidentally dig up a plant or push dirt on top if it as you dig up weeds. Row crop cultivators have shields for early cultivation, but you can pull the shields up or remove them as the season goes on. You can also drive faster as the crop grows larger in size.

In other parts of the world, row crop cultivation is already a part of farm life. These implements make it possible to perform highly detailed row crop cultivation at higher speeds. I'm not sure how this would balance out as I'm sure there are fairly inexpensive, used row-

crop cultivators available in someone's tree row, and the more modern version is probably expensive. However, farmers will have to balance the money they save on a used cultivator with the cost of someone to drive the tractor and the economy of scale.

The change in mindset may be a challenge too. Farmers, who are driven to work as fast as possible, and who are now focusing for hours, at slow speeds might be like a sprinter's first try at yoga. Try mowing your yard at about a third of your normal speed and you will see what I mean. Row crop cultivation is fairly high stakes, too; one moment's inattention can wipe out several rows. For this reason, it is a high-value job that can't be left for the low man on the totem pole while everyone else goes to the lake.

I hope issues with Dicamba get resolved before the next planting season. If they don't, row crop cultivators may be one popular display at the next farm show you attend - virtual or not. One thing, cultivating in between rows will save you dollars on all of those yoga lessons.

DNR survey looks at how Minnesotans feel about wolves

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, in partnership with the University of Minnesota through the Minnesota Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit, conducted a survey of Minnesota residents to support the 2020 update to the Minnesota Wolf Management Plan.

The study focused on three groups: Minnesota households, resident adult firearms deer hunters and livestock producers that operate in the 2019 wolf range. The main purpose of the study was to collect baseline information on these three groups' attitudes and values for wolves and wolf management. Importantly, these

data were collected using scientific survey methods, and are representative of the populations.

What was the study's purpose? The study's aim was to obtain timely and accurate information on Minnesotans' values, beliefs, and attitudes toward wolves and wolf management.

The study is based on questionnaires distributed to 9,750 individuals, including 5,250 residents, 2,000 deer hunters and 2,500 livestock producers. The results are compiled in a summary report PDF and a more detailed 149-page full report PDF.

What were the key survey topics? The survey asked questions about individuals' experiences with wolves, their interest in wolf management, their general attitudes toward wolves and reasons for valuing wolves. The survey also asked questions about their preference on wolf abundance, where wolves should exist or not

exist, whether wolf hunting and trapping should be allowed and other wolf management preferences.

The study was designed to identify differences and similarities among the three groups.

In addition, residents were asked questions related to their involvement with wolves, wildlife and outdoor recreation. Deer hunters were asked questions about their hunting experiences and beliefs. Livestock producers in the wolf range were asked about their experiences and opinions about wolf depredation.

What were the key findings? Key findings were largely consistent with previous study results, which is to say Minnesotans continue to agree on some topics regarding wolves and wolf management and agree less on other topics.

Still, there are things that Minnesotans agree on despite having a wide array of attitudes. For example, Min-

nesotans agree that maintaining a wolf population in Minnesota is important.

Residents, on average, felt that they would like to see wolf numbers remain the same, and for wolves to occupy about the same amount of habitat in the state.

The survey found that 80 percent or more of livestock producers and deer hunters support establishing both a wolf hunting and wolf trapping season. That level of support is considerably higher than what the general public believes. Support among residents is split along ideological lines (41 percent support hunting, and 30 percent support trapping).

Another portion of the survey included questions about citizen trust in the DNR. A survey finding was that residents have the highest trust in the DNR and livestock producers in the wolf range the least. Deer hunters were in the middle.

(Continued from Page 1) had voted in opposition to Bassett's request, he would still be able to reapply for his position. On Thursday, July 16 (three days after the committee meeting), Bassett asked that his request be removed from the council agenda for the following week and indicated that he had now planned to resign.

At the committee meeting, Bassett said, "I'm sorry to bring this before this committee and ask, but I'm just asking this one time during these odd set of circumstances."

Bassett, a 16-year veteran of the department, had applied for another job and had been hired by the Department of Corrections. However, he said he had received a phone call earlier that day, informing him that he may "get bumped" and not have the job, be laid off immediately or be laid off in three months.

Human Resources Specialist LeAnn Engelstad said the council has never received such a request in the past. By state statute, a resignation is final once it is submitted to a city. However, Engelstad noted that an employee can appeal the resignation. Since the council had already approved filling the position and advertising for it, the full council needed to consider Bassett's request.

Engelstad voiced some concerns about allowing Bassett to rescind his resignation. She wondered whether Bassett would submit his resignation again two months from now. Engelstad also questioned how it would look on the city's part that it advertised for this position and then decided to not fill it. At the same time, she referred to Bassett's experience working with the Thief River Falls Police Department.

Engelstad said the city has already incurred costs to fill the position. However, she added, "As of yesterday, we haven't received any applications yet."

Aarestad said he would hate to make a practice of allowing employees to rescind their resignations.

Prudhomme replied that no one expected a future job to be frozen or cut as part of a pandemic.

For his part, Bassett said the phone call came out of nowhere. He noted he has a 5-year-old daughter, and his family wouldn't know what to do if he were unable to keep his job in Thief River Falls. About applying elsewhere, Bassett said he wants to end his career in Thief River Falls.

Aarestad asked whether Bassett had applied for other positions over the past few years.

Bassett replied that he wouldn't deny it, but he said he was planning to make this move to be closer to his family. "That job right now is unstable and continues to be unstable," he said.

Interim Police Chief Marissa Adam had spoken with a DOC representative. Adam said she had been told layoffs happen often in the DOC.

After Bassett exited the meeting, committee members continued their discussion of the situation. He has applied for "many, many positions," Aarestad said.

Council member Steve Narverud, who sits on the committee, worried about the precedent that would be set if the council allowed Bassett to rescind his resignation. He also referred to the reputation the city would have if it advertised the position and then decided to allow Bassett to keep his job.


"Once again, COVID is an extraordinary circumstance we did not expect to be put in," Prudhomme replied.

Aarestad said, "I think we stick with what's been done."

Prevention is key to fight/Continued

(Continued from Page 1) had steep climbs in COVID-19 cases last week. Polk County cases continue to climb.

Statewide, COVID-19 cases per-day had been in the 200s and 300s. Jore said that number has since jumped significantly to the 600s and 700s. She attributed the increase to going to bars, and attending gatherings such as weddings and Fourth of July events. Jore said it is difficult to conduct contact tracing when someone has been to multiple places in public for several days in a row.

County Board learned that the county is eligible for \$1,784,000 in Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act funding. The funding will reimburse eligible expenses related to the county's COVID-19 prevention efforts.

Commissioner Neil Peterson has been appointed to work with department leaders to determine how much the county has spent to prevent COVID-19.

Chairperson Darryl Tveitbakk expected that the county would seek reimbursement for allowing employees to work remotely. Among those employees are some in the Pennington County Human Services Department. Human Services Director Julie Sjostrand said there are still some employees working remotely. "I have most people back two days a week and looking at a third day coming into play," she said.

Sjostrand indicated that the six-foot distance requirement is an issue. Another issue has been laptop computers as some of the employees need that equipment to do their jobs. She was expected to provide quotes to County Board in the future.

Tveitbakk believed that the county may be reimbursed for that purchase through the CARES Act.

Besides being reimbursed for its own costs, the county may use some of its CARES Act funding to help small businesses. Tveitbakk expected that county leaders would discuss that prospect in the future.

Updates provided on TRF roundabouts

The Thief River Falls area could be called the land of construction. Pennington County Engineer Mike Flaagan provided an update on the county's construction projects at the County Board meeting Tuesday, July 14.

The third time was the charm for Schroeder Construction when it set beams on the Mark Boulevard bridge. It tried two other times to set the beams, but it was stymied by high water one week and a roller the second time. The firm was able to install the beams this

week. Seven beams, measuring about 118 feet each, were placed on the two piers.

An additional 14 beams are expected to be installed on the two end spans starting next week, Flaagan said in an interview with the Northern Watch on Wednesday, July 15.

Construction continues on the county's two roundabouts. At the County Board meeting, Flaagan said the contractor plans to pave the Highway 32 roundabout next week and have it open to traffic by Saturday, Aug. 1. After that time, the bypass road will be removed and the contractor will finish

working on the leg of the roundabout adjacent to Brodin Comfort Systems.

Commissioner Cody Hempel asked Flaagan whether he had any concerns about semi drivers traveling on the Highway 32 roundabout.

"I don't have any worries with the size it is right now," Flaagan said.

Pennington County is also building a roundabout adjacent to Challenger Elementary School. Flaagan expected that class 3 gravel would be replaced this week in that area. He said curb and gutter are set to be installed next week.

Flaagan was asked about the Minnesota Department of Transportation roundabouts on Highway 1. MnDOT is constructing three roundabouts at intersections with the following roadways – Brooks Avenue, Barzen Avenue and Highway 59 North.

"They've had a lot of issues," Flaagan said. He referred to weather problems as well as problems obtaining supplies. Flaagan estimated that the Brooks Avenue roundabout (adjacent to the Thief River Falls American Legion Club) would be open in two to three weeks.

Northland nursing program earns ranking/Continued

(Continued from Page 1) campus and at area health care facilities.

In the fall of 2016, Northland streamlined its entire practical nursing program reducing it to 44 credits. This created a diploma program that is a prerequisite to Northland's registered nursing program. The program's curriculum underwent an evolution as well, focusing on a concept-based

curriculum that has students going beyond simply memorizing facts to understanding the larger patterns and relationships that define patient care and patient illness.

With these changes, Northland has been maintaining a near 90% first-time NCLEX-PN licensure exam pass rate which hovers above state and national pass rate percentages. Even

in light of course delivery modifications due to COVID-19, the spring class of 2020 boasted an NCLEX-PN pass rate over 96%.

Northland's practical nursing program continues to be one of the school's most prominent programs. With front-line nursing professionals in high demand, interest remains high. "We have accepted 40 students on our EGF campus, 15 on

our TRF campus, and 15 in our distance/hybrid cohort for fall 2020 semester," said Sorvig. "We have a 40 student capacity for each campus, each semester, as well as 30 for our distance/hybrid model. That results in 140 to 160 practical nursing students in our program at any given time."

Make a plan now for emergencies

With increasing positive cases of COVID-19 as a backdrop, state health department officials asked residents to consider making a plan in case of emergencies.

Minnesota offers Make a Plan Minnesota on its COVID-19 update web page as a tool for Minnesotans to use to develop an emergency plan. On the page it states, "It is never too early to develop a plan for your family. It is also a good idea to revisit and update existing plans. This is especially true during the COVID-19 pandemic, which is requiring us to plan in different ways than other emergencies. One important plan to have in place is what to do if a parent or guardian becomes sick or hospitalized due to

the virus."

Wednesday, July 15, Kris Ehresmann, infectious diseases director at the Minnesota Department of Health, said she is confident more will get sick and require hospitalization. They also know that if one person in a household gets sick, others in the house will get sick. She also said they have received reports of instances in which the parents were too sick to care for their children for a short period of time. Because of this possibility, she said it is important to create a plan for their care if parents are unable to provide that care.

The tool provided is not just an admonition to make a plan, but provides a template for that plan. The template includes space for important addresses and phone numbers, insurance

information, emergency contacts, religious affiliation and contacts, other community contacts, child information, such as comfort items, primary physician, prescriptions, school, child contacts and space for information that might be useful if one or

both parents are incapacitated.

That template can be found by searching www.mn.gov/covid19, or entering Make a Plan Minnesota in the search field of a browser.

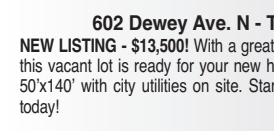
