How and at what cost?

TRF City Council discusses management of TRF Fire Dept.

Discussions continue about possibly restructuring the Thief River Falls Fire Department into a fire department overseen by one fire chief. Currently, the department is led by two co-fire chiefs.

At their Committee of the Whole meeting Tuesday, June 21, Thief River Falls City Council members agreed to send the matter

back to the Public Safety/Liquor Committee for further discussion. The latter committee will meet Monday, July 11 at 4:30 p.m. at City Hall. Council members also plan to survey full-time and volunteer firefighters regarding their thoughts.

That decision came after a lengthy discussion in front of a packed crowd. Most of those individuals serve as volunteer firefighters. Co-Fire Chief Marty Semanko

told council members that he didn't ask them to attend the meeting. As if to punctuate the matter, the Thief River Falls Fire Department received a fire call during the City Council meeting immediately prior to the committee meeting. The crowd dispersed at that time and returned a short time later for the discussion about the fire department.

For the past 25 years, the city has employed two co-fire chiefs. City leaders are now

in the midst of determining whether to restructure the department with one fire chief upon a vacancy created by Semanko's retirement. Semanko has announced his intention to retire Friday, Sept. 2.

Semanko and Co-Fire Chief Rick Beier apparently asked the council to shift to a combination fire department served by one chief. Beier referred to the complexities of two people working together to manage a department. However, the co-chiefs indicated that they have a great working relationship.

Further complicating matters is that, no matter what the council members decide regarding department management, the department will be short one full-time firefighter when Semanko retires. Semanko and Beier are a part of the rotation that mans the Fire Hall and responds to fires as needed. If the council decides to hire a full-time fire chief, that position would be part of the Management, Administration, Professional and Supervisory union. Currently, the co-fire chiefs are a part of the Teamsters union.

What led to this point

The combination full-time and volunteer fire department serves the City of Thief River Falls and six area townships. Its service area encompasses 198 square miles. The current fire service agreement expires in spring 2024.

Currently, the department has seven full-time firefighters, including the two co-fire chiefs, and 24 volunteer firefighters.

The co-fire chiefs each receive a \$400 per month

stipend to serve in their positions. Their positions aren't management positions. Currently, if an employment issue crops up in the fire department, the co-fire chiefs need to consult with the city's human resources specialist and/or the city administrator.

Volunteers receive \$580 per year for their service. Volunteers also receive retirement benefits once they turn 50 and have served as a volunteer firefighter for 20 years. They accrue \$3,000 per year. The city doesn't contribute to those retirement benefits since that money comes from the firefighter relief surcharge.

A month ago, the Public Safety/Liquor Committee recommended starting the process to fill the soon-to-bevacated firefighter position. Prior to formally submitting the recommendation to the council, Beier recalled he repeatedly asked committee members whether this was what they wanted. They assured him it was.

The matter was placed on the agenda for the council meeting May 17. However, without warning, council member and Public Safety/Liquor Committee Chairperson Jason Aarestad asked to remove it from the agenda and send it back to committee. The co-fire chiefs were blindsided.

The co-fire chiefs then discussed the matter with the Public Safety/Liquor Committee eight days before the Committee of the Whole meeting. The latter meeting was called in order for all of the council members to discuss the matter. At that time, Semanko indicated

Environmental assessment for Hwy. 11 issued

The Minnesota Department of Transportation invites the public to attend an open house and public hearing regarding the reconditioning and safety improvements project on Highway 11 between Roseau and Warroad. The proposed project includes resurfacing between 17th Avenue Northeast in Roseau and Highway 313 in Warroad, realignment of 1.3 miles of Highway 11 south of the Roseau Municipal Airport, and reconstructing Highway 11 between 550th Avenue and 570th Av-

enue to a three-lane section. The open house and public hearing will be held Wednesday, June 29, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m., at the Roseau Civic Center, 121 Center St. E., in Roseau. The event will provide an opportunity for citizens to review the proposed project and potential environmental impacts, make comments, and ask questions with MnDOT officials and project staff. There will be a formal presentation starting at 5:30 p.m. followed by a time for public comments.

The Environmental Assessment/Environmental Assessment Worksheet document states the purpose and need of the project along with the anticipated social, economic and environmental impacts. The document is available on the project website at www.mndot.gov/d2/projects/hwy11-roseau_warroad.

Drought relief app window opens

Minnesota livestock farmers and specialty crop producers can now apply for up to \$7,500 per farm in reimbursement for expenses incurred due to last year's drought, through the Minnesota Department of Agriculture's 2021 Agricultural Drought Relief Program.

"Last year's drought caused hardship for lots of farmers, and we want to get help to them so they can pay a few bills," MDA Commissioner Thom Petersen said. "Whether it was buying feed, installing irrigation, or something else, we know there were a lot of extra costs last year that we're hoping to offset with this opportunity."

The Legislature appropriated \$8.1 million for drought relief, which will reimburse farm operators for drought-related expenses incurred after June 1, 2021, and before May 23, 2022.

Farms must be located in a county designated by the USDA as a primary natural disaster area after July 19, 2021 and before Jan. 1, 2022, or in a county contiguous to a designated county. All Minnesota counties except Goodhue, Rice, Wabasha, and Winona are eligible.

Eligible expenses for specialty crop producers include water handling equipment;

Management of TRF Fire Department discussed/Continued

(Continued from Page 1) that this latest discussion could have been handled a month earlier. Semanko and Mayor Brian Holmer blamed each other for the reason why they hadn't communicated earlier. Semanko eventually said he didn't call Holmer or Aarestad prior to the meeting because he nearly had a letter of reprimand placed in his file the last time he called one of them after a meeting.

Eight full-time firefighters?
In a little more than two months, Semanko will retire from the department. At least one council member thought that the upcoming firefighter vacancy needed to be handled right away. Council member Steve Narverud said he believed the fire chief discussion should be separated from the potential hiring of a firefighter.

Narverud's comments led Holmer to say that the city could then end up with eight full-time firefighters. If the city employed one fire chief, Holmer said it would need to open the position up to the public. If that were the case, a member of the public, someone not currently serving as a full-time firefighter, could potentially become chief.

Holmer continued to advocate grouping the two matters together. He indicated the department has worked short-staffed in the past. Holmer said the fire department worked well when the late Co-Fire Chief Jerry Stenseth was out for a year as he battled cancer. Stenseth never returned to the department and died in 2016.

Semanko briefly interrupted Holmer at that point, leading Holmer to say, "I will address who will speak here."

Holmer added that the city didn't lose any property when Stenseth was battling cancer. He further noted that the city has a lot of capable volunteer firefighters and he said he didn't think that a full-time firefighter needed two or three months of training.

Stenseth's medical leave hasn't been the only time the department has faced

staffing issues. Recently, a firefighter suffered an injury that led to a six-month leave. Semanko said the other six full-time firefighters' lives were upended in the meantime. Regarding Stenseth's cancer battle, he said the firefighters pitched in since they were doing it for Stenseth. He added that the department didn't run flawlessly at that point and it cost the city overtime.

Holmer asked about the number of personnel staffing the Fire Hall at one time. The number of on-duty full-time firefighters is dictated by the number of fires typically reported at that time. Most of the time, there are two firefighters on duty at night, said Semanko, who noted it takes time for volunteers to respond at night. Semanko said there are fewer firefighters on Saturdays and Sundays since most of the industries are shut down and, especially in the summer, many residents are out of the area.

Holmer broached the possibility of offering an additional stipend to volunteers if they stay overnight at the Fire Hall.

Semanko replied that the East Grand Forks Fire Department offered a stipend to volunteers. That department has since asked to fill a full-time position because

it didn't work well.

Holmer then suggested paying the volunteers more. Council member Rachel Prudhomme weighed in, saying that fires occur at inconvenient times and firefighters miss holidays and their kids' activities.

Holmer, who has worked in emergency services in the past, replied that he knows what it's like.

Joe Ose, who serves an Excel Township clerk, encouraged council members to not lose sight of fire protection. He said the city can't nickel and dime fire protection when the fire department protects hundreds of millions of dollars worth of property.

Other township representatives attended the meeting. Scott Bergland, who serves as the chairperson of the North Township Board, said the townships pay more than \$100,000 per year for fire protection from the fire department. He equated that amount to the cost of one full-time firefighter. In addition, the townships also pay for equipment. Bergland asked the council members whether it would be smart to consult with the townships before considering any changes.

Holmer replied that this was the first discussion with the full council. He said the council was looking at all of its options and there currently wasn't enough data to make a decision yet.

"Is there a structure that we want to go with?" asked Holmer. "Is there a structure that we want to stay with?"

Holmer also referred to the department's budget of \$750,000, which led Aarestad to mention the increasing cost of fuel and how the council needs to work in the best interest of the taxpayer. At the same time, Aarestad said he supports the fire department.

At least two council members were willing to provide some insight into their thoughts about how the fire department should be structured. Council member Anthony Bolduc said he believed one person should be in charge of the department, similar to how the Electric, Water Systems and Police departments operate.

Council member Mike Lorensen said he loved that Brainerd operated with a chief and an assistant chief. He added that he was frustrated by Johnson telling the council how to do their job.

Johnson, who has worked for the city for decades, responded that he has seen how the city operates over the years and he encouraged the council to be cautious.

teen fire department. As they have said in the past, both Aarestad and Semanko said they have no idea where that rumor started.

Holmer was also surprised about the rumors. He said, "We never said anything about losing fire protection in this community."

Beier believed that some of the rumors may have originated from Holmer's recent appearance on Open Line, where he apparently referred to all options being on the table.

Additional potential restructuring
The committee also discussed the potential restructuring of the Electric and Water Systems departments, which will be featured in a Times article next week. In particular, Holmer referred to the opportunity to hire a general manager to oversee both departments.

Before that discussion could begin, Water Systems Superintendent Wayne Johnson had a few words for council members regarding the survey of firefighters. "You people are elected to make informed decisions. You don't survey the help to see how they want to be managed," he said.

Johnson added that the council needs to quit basing their decisions on a few complaints from social media, and anonymous emails or texts. He said they're usually from uninformed people.

Lorensen disagreed with Johnson. He noted he wanted to understand the inside and outside of the fire department to help guide the council to a decision.

Johnson replied that the survey responses will be dictated by whatever is occurring in the department at that point in time. He used the example of a survey about residents that may be coincidentally timed with a lack of snowplowing on a particular city street. As a result, in that instance, the survey results would be skewed toward complaints about the Public Works Department.

Johnson also took issue with surveying the volunteers. "What do the volunteers have to do with the day-to-day structure of a city department?" he asked.

Lorensen replied that the council is considering a change in command. He added that he was frustrated by Johnson telling the council how to do their job.

Phone and Internet Discounts Available to CenturyLink Customers

The Minnesota Public Utilities Commission designated CenturyLink as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier within its service area for universal service purposes. (Continued from Page 1) water hauling; wells; irrigation equipment; replacement plants, seeds, or seedlings; additional hired labor; farm-

ers' market fees for canceled markets; and more.

Eligible expenses for livestock farmers include water-related expenses; feed-related expenses; custom bailing; equipment rental; livestock transportation; livestock pond dredging; cover crop, pasture, or forage replanting; fencing; grazing rights; additional hired labor; and more.

In addition to a completed application, you must submit an IRS Form W-9 and a list of all drought-related expenses. Documentation of these expenses does not need to be submitted with the application, but you must be able to make it available for examination if requested.

If the total amount requested from all eligible applicants during the initial application period exceeds the total amount of funds available, all applications will be pro-rated.

Applicants are highly encouraged to submit their application through the online grants management system to ensure it is received in a timely manner. Applications completed online or emailed must be received by 5 p.m. on July 6, 2022. Mailed applications must be postmarked July 6 and received no later than July 12, 2022 to be considered.

Cor Powersports owners Todd and Andrea Myers are would like to dispell rumors that they are selling and shutting down their snowmobile racing circuit. They are in fact doing the exact opposite.

In a letter to members, the Myers stated:

"This all started a few months ago when we listed one of our trucks for sale and let people know we would be selling off the two gooseneck trailers; we are doing this as part of a new relationship with a series partner and in an effort to help reduce overhead costs.

"As many of you see first hand there are numerous worker shortages and we at Cor PowerSports had the same issues with filling certain full time seasonal roles like driving the gooseneck trailers to and from every race. Last season Todd drove both trailers to every round and with the future expenses appearing to stay similar we had to take steps to reduce this workload as well as lower our operating costs.

"We had two choices when project planning for the 2023 race season: Run as we have been and pass added expenses on to the racers or figure out how to cut costs. We chose the latter as with the

current economy the last thing we want to do is raise prices."

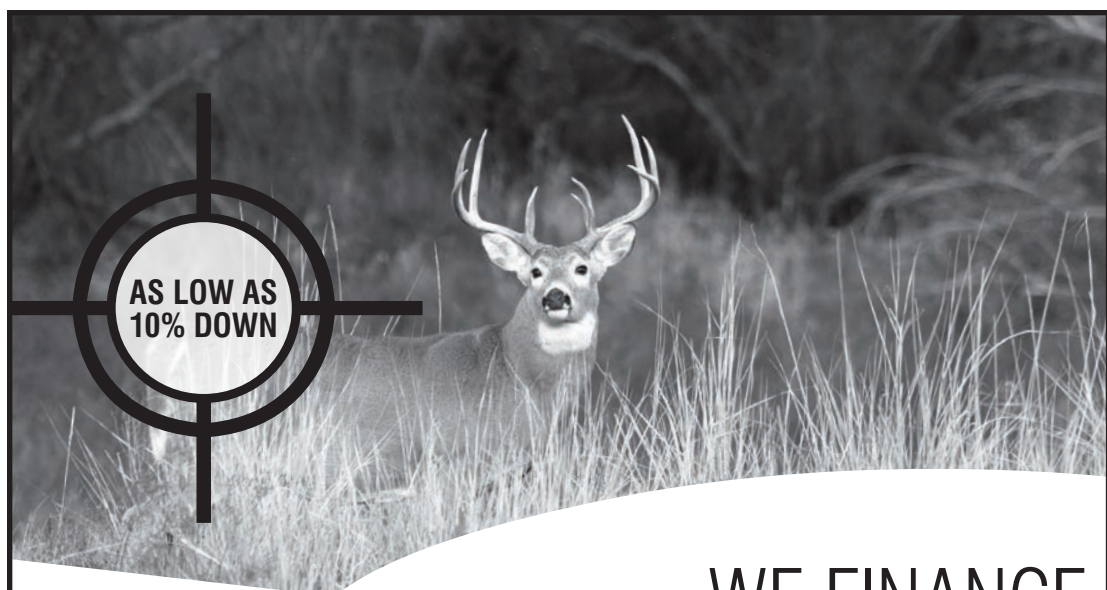
The Myers have been in discussions with several potential manufacturers and dealers and landed with Capital Renegade.

"Chad at Capital Renegade understands the needs in a trailer for racing as he himself races dirt track cars," the Myers stated. "We have been working with Capital Renegade for the past few months on trailer layout, and with the help from inTech trailers designers the trailer is now going into production and should be here in September.

"Many have asked how buying a new trailer will reduce our operating expenses... We have eliminated the need for a second Class A driver, a second truck / trailer, insurance, maintenance, and operating costs of running two trucks. With that being said we also would like to announce that we have not raised fees for the 2023 season."

Season membership for the 2023 Cor PowerSports season opened Tuesday. The 2023 season schedule is in its final planning stages and the 7-8 races should be announced in July.

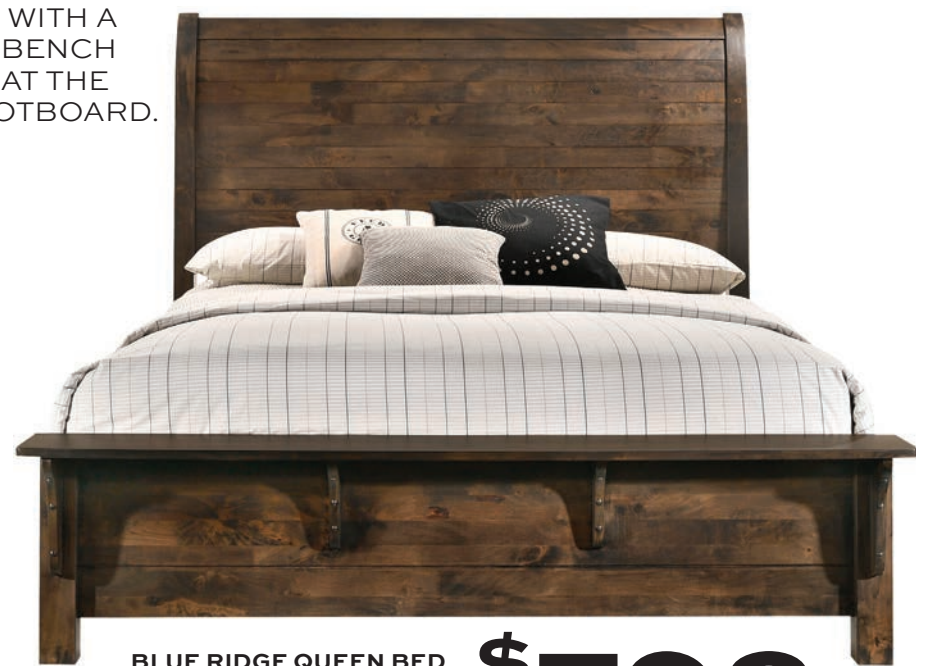
