Meet Lt. Gov. Briley Olsonawski

Briley Olsonawski has a newfound appreciation for politics after attending Boys State from June 8-14 at Saint John's University in Collegeville.

Briley was one of five Lincoln High School students selected to participate in the annual event that provides a practical learning experience in local and state government. Other LHS soon-to-be seniors selected for the honor included Aaron Collins, Andy Dagg, Ryan Flaagan and Cooper Skjerven. Each year, American Legion Post 117 in Thief

River Falls sends LHS juniors to the event. Those students are selected through cooperation of the post, high school faculty and others.

"I think it was a really good experience," said Briley, who encouraged others to participate in Boys State if given the opportunity.

Briley took advantage of the opportunity given to him and ran with it. Like many politicians, he began his political career in city government at Boys State and climbed his way up the political ladder. Briley's knowledge of parliamentary procedure, gained through the Thief River Falls FFA chapter, helped him make

his way to the top.

After serving as the chairperson of his city and county Nationalist Party conventions, Briley eventually ran for state chairperson. The other "political party" at Boys State was the Federalist Party.

Running for state party chairperson led to some memorable moments. Two other candidates vied for the title. The voting was tied seven times until finally Briley was named the victor. "That was my favorite voting moment of it all," he said.

Briley was soon voted House of Representatives speaker. He said the House

passed some fun bills, which were ultimately shot down by the Senate.

Before long, Briley found himself running for lieutenant governor. Speaking to all of the boys in attendance, he said he knows they can make changes. He also told them that he believed they could pass the first constitutional amendment at Boys State in 60 years. Later, Briley learned that his reference book was outdated and a constitutional amendment had been passed in the last 60 years. Briley won that election. According to Post 117 Boys

While Briley realized his aptitude for politics and further developed his public speaking skills at Boys State, Boys State wasn't on his radar. After he graduates from LHS next spring, he plans to obtain a degree in mechanical engineering. Prior to Boys State, one wouldn't find him talking about politics. Politics carried a negative connotation for him at that time. He said he thought it was divisive. Participating in Boys State helped him realize that government provides people with a voice.

Rural Reflections ...

The Retrievers change the course of all loss and desperation

My wife and I are pet owners and know the worry of what would happen if one of them got lost. It is a terrible, helpless feeling and results in a scattered, desperate search. Hopefully, there will be a safe return; however, it is often left to chance.

A search for a lost pet has played against the woods and fields around Thief River Falls for the last seven weeks. Meiko the Australian Shepherd left home this spring and was soon over his head in the panic that soon became survival mode. It's the kind of story that typically ends in mystery or unrevealed tragedy: A domestic animal without its domestic home.

This story of loss revealed to me a group of volunteers who make the search for lost animals more than a lonely, futile exercise. This group is named for what they do —

“The Retrievers.” They work to find your missing pet, they do it well and they do it for free. It is this work I want to tell you about.

I recently spoke with DeAnn Syverson, who was the case manager for Meiko, the missing Aussie Shepherd. I got to know Syverson when I joined a small group of volunteers who wanted to help find Meiko.

“The Retrievers” were a new concept to me and, I suspect, to others. I wanted to learn more about this group that finds our treasured animal friends when they go missing.

Syverson told me that the group helps locate domestic animals, mostly dogs, but others may also apply for help through theretrievers.org. She said that their best tool for locating a lost pet are the large signs they place at busy intersections with a contact number. Syverson said finding Meiko was a very memorable experience, rivaling another where The Retrievers were facing a real deadline as they successfully found an emaciated dog before a 24-inch snowstorm hit. That particular dog went home with Syverson to stay. If you ever have a missing pet,

check theretrievers.org website for an online academy that is a great resource, maybe even check it out prior to such an incident. Syverson also asked that if you find any signs laying in a ditch, to call the number on the sign, so they can be recovered.

The case of the missing Meiko stretched out over almost two months. He had recently been rehomed and got loose only days from being introduced to his new home. He refused to settle in one area and would be seen 20 miles away within 24 hours of a sighting. He crossed the river several times and was sighted in locations all over the immediate area. Meiko finally settled into an area east of Thief River Falls and began eating from a feeding station with a camera that had been prepared with food, water and scent to attract him. When he became accustomed to the area, a live trap was set for him which he stepped into over the Independence Day weekend.

This little ghost of a dog was now very real and was recovered by a volunteer working with a ground support coordinator from The Retrievers. Meiko's owners

felt he would do better with a rescue group, so he was transported to a new start. This was Meiko's first night in weeks with his own food, water and a soft place to sleep. The truth is that the whole time he was running from all things foreign to him, he had occupied a soft place in the hearts of strangers who did not know him but wanted to help him.

This rescue took so many volunteers all working together to create a happy ending. Besides The Retrievers and the local volunteers, there was a foster home that housed Meiko until he could be transported to a rescue who would help him find a home. There was also another rescue group who agreed to pay for his veterinary bills and friendly landowners who allowed the set up of feeding stations on their property.

The world is a scary place of strange faces for a lost pet. It is only the quiet work of those who care that can change the course of all loss and desperation. It is that way in the world and it is so in the work of The Retrievers.

Public input sought on reducing Minnesota statewide walleye limit

Changes in lake habitat, ecology and conditions coupled with technological advances in fishing gear and methods are prompting the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to seek public input on a possible reduction in the statewide walleye possession limit from six to four fish.

If enacted via a rulemaking process, the change would not become effective until May 2027.

"We consider this a proactive step to maintain quality walleye fishing," said Brad Parsons, DNR fisheries section manager. "This regulation has been in place since 1956, and conditions in Minnesota's lakes have, and continue to, change. Our consideration of a walleye limit reduction is a wise management response to what's happening."

People can view additional details and share their thoughts on the regulation being considered through Friday, Aug. 15, by visiting the DNR's walleye web page (mndnr.gov/walleye) and completing the online questionnaire.

The DNR's most-recent

statewide angler survey results reported that 48% of respondents favored the change and 23% were opposed. Remaining respondents had no opinion.

Results of more than 4,000 on-the-water interviews with anglers about their catches conducted from 2021-2023 showed 67% supported the change, 18% opposed and 15% were neutral.

Factors the DNR considered in its decision to suggest the reduction:

- Anglers have become much more effective at catching fish due to technological advances in everything from fishing line to mobile ice fishing houses, and particularly because of GPS devices and incredibly sensitive fish finding electronics.

- Ice fishing has exploded in popularity, as evidenced by more than 3 million hours of fishing effort in the winter of 2019 on Mille Lacs Lake and Lake of the Woods.

- Social media postings alert anglers to where the fish are biting and anglers can move there quickly, potentially depleting local walleye populations.

- Peer-reviewed scientific

studies continue to show that system changes related to climate and invasive species may be detrimental to walleye populations and more conducive to other species in northern temperate lakes like those in Minnesota.

- All but two (Cass and Winnibogoshish lakes) of the state's 10 largest inland lakes, which produce about 40 percent of Minnesota's annual walleye harvest, already have a lower limit. Resorts on Kabetogema, Lake of the Woods, Leech, Pepin, Rainy and Vermilion have not reported a decline in business due to a lower walleye limit.

All surrounding states and provinces — and Minnesota's border waters with them — have walleye daily limits less than six.

"Simplifying our regulations also is a factor," Parsons said. "This change would cause less confusion by providing regulation consistency across most of our lakes."

Watercraft, gear must meet Canadian aquatic invasive species requirements before entering Canada

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds boaters and anglers that Canada requires watercraft and equipment to meet Canadian aquatic invasive species regulations before crossing into Canada.

Canada Border Services Agency's Memorandum D19-8-5 (<https://www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/publications/dm-m/d/d19/d19-8-5-eng.html>) says travelers towing or transporting boats, trailers and water-related equipment at any border crossing must ensure that these items are free of AIS; cleaned of aquatic plants, animals, mud and debris; drained of water; and dry before entering Canada. Hot water decontamination by trained staff might be required for any equipment not meeting requirements upon inspection, and these decontamination units might not be available nearby.

"As with any other aspect of crossing the border, it's up to travelers to make sure their boats and equipment are in compliance," DNR Watercraft Inspection Supervisor Tina Fitzgerald said. "Canada's AIS prevention regulations are a little different from Minnesota's."

If someone has been previously denied entry into Canada due to an AIS violation and wants to try entering again, Canada requires proof of decontamination.

Proof can be a completed "contaminated watercraft — conditions for re-entry" form that is provided by the Canadian border agent. You may bring your watercraft and this form to a Minnesota watercraft decontamination station. Upon completion of the decontamination, you can fill out the form and return it to the border agent. Please note, the nearest Minnesota decontamination unit may be more than 100 miles away from the Canadian border and not staffed every day of the week.

"The DNR and authorized government units typically operate decontamination stations where they'll do the most good to help prevent the spread of AIS in Minnesota," Fitzgerald said. "It is ultimately the owner's responsibility to ensure their boat and equipment are in compliance with AIS laws wherever they are traveling."

Minnesota based AIS programs do not provide separate forms or receipts that can be used as proof of decontamination for your trip into Canada, because boaters can legally complete decontamination on their own within Minnesota.

Minnesota law requires people to:

- Clean watercraft, trailers and equipment to remove aquatic plants and prohibited invasive species.

- Drain all water and leave drain plugs out during transport.

- Dispose of unwanted bait in the trash.

- Never release bait, plants or aquarium pets into Minnesota waters.

- Dry docks, lifts and rafts for 21 days before moving them from one water body to another.

These additional steps reduce the risk of spreading aquatic invasive species:

- Decontaminate watercraft and equipment — find free stations on the courtesy decontamination page of the DNR website (mndnr.gov/decon).

- Spray watercraft and equipment with high-pressure water or rinse with water if high-pressure water is not available.

- Dry watercraft and equipment for at least five days before using in another water body.

People should contact a Minnesota DNR aquatic invasive species specialist (mndnr.gov/invasives/ais/contacts.html) if they think they have found any invasive species that was not already known to be in the water body.

Minnesota DNR seeks input on proposed special fishing regulations

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources asks for input on several special fishing regulation proposals.

Each year, the Minnesota DNR reviews existing fishing regulations, proposes new special regulations that apply to individual waters and asks the public for input about the proposals. All new special regulations are reviewed on a regular basis to evaluate effectiveness.

The DNR is proposing either new regulations or changes to existing experimental and special fishing regulations for the 2026 fishing season that address the following topics:

- Sand Lake walleye (Itasca County)
- Rainy Lake walleye (St. Louis and Koochiching counties)

- Platte Lake sunfish (Crow Wing County)

- Sullivan Lake sunfish (Morrison County)

- Green Prairie Fish Lake sunfish (Morrison County)

- Long (Higgins) Lake sunfish (Todd County)

- Moose Lake sunfish (Todd County)

- Maple Lake sunfish (Todd County)

- Jewett Lake sunfish (Otter Tail County)

- North and South Ten Mile Lakes sunfish (Otter Tail County)

- German Lake sunfish (Otter Tail County)

- Rush Lake sunfish (Otter Tail County)

- Rabideau Lake sunfish (Beltrami County)

New education requirements are in effect for some boaters

Minnesota long has required people between the ages of 12 and 17 to obtain a watercraft operator's permit to operate certain types of motorized boats in the state. In 2023, the state Legislature passed a law expanding that requirement.

As of July 1, 2025, anyone age 12 or older and born after June 30, 2004, is required to have a valid watercraft operator's permit to operate a motorboat or personal watercraft on Minnesota waters. (The new law does not affect people who already have a permit.)

The requirement gradually includes more age groups, and by July 1, 2028, anyone born after June 30, 1987, will need a valid watercraft operator's permit to operate a motorboat or personal watercraft on Minnesota waters.

Although the DNR recommends everyone obtain their watercraft operator's permit,




Trump Administration announces expedited congressionally-mandated disaster assistance for farmers

U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Brooke L. Rollins has announced that agricultural producers who suffered eligible crop losses due to natural disasters in 2023 and 2024 can now apply for \$16 billion in assistance through the Supplemental Disaster Relief Program.

To expedite the implementation of SDRP, USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) is delivering assistance in two stages. This first stage is open to producers with eligible crop losses that received assistance under crop insurance or the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program during 2023 and 2024. Stage One sign up will start in person at FSA county offices now and pre-filled applications were mailed to producers Wednesday, July 9. SDRP Stage Two signups for eligible shallow or uncovered

losses will begin in early fall. "American farmers are no stranger to natural disasters that cause losses that leave no region or crop unscathed. Under President Trump's leadership, USDA has worked around the clock to deliver this relief directly to our farmers," said Rollins. "We are taking swift action to ensure farmers will have the resources they need to continue to produce the safest, most reliable, and most abundant food supply in the world."

This announcement follows Rollins' comprehensive plan to deliver the total amount of congressionally-appropriated \$30 billion in disaster assistance to farmers and ranchers this year. These programs will complement the forthcoming state block grants that USDA is working with 14 different states to develop.

To date, USDA has issued more than \$7.8 billion in Emergency Commodity Assistance Program payments to more than half a million eligible producers. Additionally, USDA has provided over \$1 billion in emergency relief through the Emergency Livestock Relief Program to producers who suffered grazing losses due to drought or wildfires in calendar years 2023 and 2024.

SDRP Stage One
FSA is launching a

streamlined, pre-filled application process for eligible crop, tree and vine losses by leveraging existing Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) and Risk Management Agency (RMA) indemnified loss data. The pre-filled applications were mailed Wednesday, July 9.

Eligible losses must be the result of natural disasters occurring in calendar years 2023 and/or 2024. These disasters include wildfires, hurricanes, floods, derechos, excessive heat, tornadoes, winter storms, freeze (including a polar vortex), smoke exposure, excessive moisture, qualifying drought, and related conditions.

To qualify for drought related losses, the loss must have occurred in a county rated by the U.S. Drought Monitor as having a D2 (se-

vere drought) for eight consecutive weeks, D3 (extreme drought), or greater intensity level during the applicable calendar year.

To apply for SDRP, producers must submit the FSA-526, Supplemental Disaster Relief Program (SDRP) Stage One Application, in addition to having other forms on file with FSA.

Stage One payments are based on the SDRP adjusted NAP or federal crop insurance coverage level the producer purchased for the crop. The net NAP or net federal crop insurance payments (NAP or crop insurance indemnities minus administrative fees and premiums) will be subtracted from the SDRP calculated payment amount.

For Stage One, the total SDRP payment to indemnified producers will not exceed 90% of the loss and an

SDRP payment factor of 35% will be applied to all Stage One payments. If additional SDRP funds remain, FSA may issue a second payment.

All producers who receive SDRP payments are required to purchase federal crop insurance or NAP coverage for the next two available crop years at the 60% coverage level or higher. Producers who fail to purchase crop insurance for the next two available crop years will be required to refund the SDRP payment, plus interest, to USDA.

SDRP Stage 2
FSA will announce additional SDRP assistance for uncovered losses, including non-indemnified shallow losses and quality losses and how to apply later this fall.


